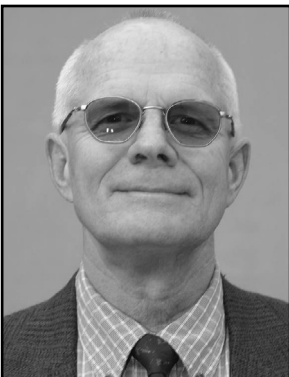


Head Coach Doug Bartlett



Doug Bartlett

SUNY-Geneseo '70 • 20th Season at VMI

Entering his 20th season at the helm of the VMI lacrosse program, Doug Bartlett enters his third decade at the Institute with enthusiasm and optimism for the years ahead.

For his first 17 seasons in Lexington, the Keydets were a program without a conference home, having to play as an independent, without the benefits of postseason honors, a conference schedule and of course opportunities to play for a championship. However, that all changed in 2003, when Bartlett led the Keydets into their first season in their new home, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

"I've waited 18 years to find a home for this program and to give it something to play for (a conference championship)," said Bartlett after his team defeated Canisius, 13-9 in its first-ever conference game. "Now VMI lacrosse is reaping the benefits of being a member of a conference." It was that moment that Bartlett knew his program was headed in a new and more promising direction.

With 107 victories at VMI to his credit, Bartlett remains the architect of the Keydet lacrosse program. In his 19 seasons, Bartlett has built his program from the ground up.

In 1986, Bartlett took over a team that began varsity play in 1983 and immediately brought respectability to the program. Six of his first seven seasons at the helm of VMI resulted in non-losing seasons while five of those were winning seasons.

In the past 19 seasons, Bartlett's accomplishments with the Keydet lacrosse program are unprecedented. His 1992 team was ranked in the Top 25 lacrosse poll, making it only the fourth team in VMI history to be ranked in a national poll, while his 1995 edition received votes as well.

Bartlett's coaching excellence and accomplishments at VMI have been repeatedly recognized by his peers. He has twice been selected as a coach for the South team in the North/South Lacrosse Classic – for the first time in 1992, and again in 1998 when he

joined Maryland coach Dick Edell on the South sidelines. Bartlett has been a featured speaker at the Southeastern Region Lacrosse Coaches Clinic and also has been a keynote speaker at the United States Lacrosse Association national convention. He currently serves as chairman of the Division I North / South Lacrosse game.

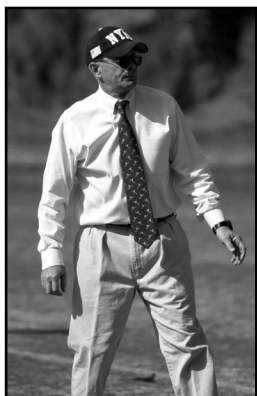
Bartlett has developed a reputation as a coach who pushes his players to excel on the field and pushes himself in the recruiting wars to obtain top notch lacrosse players for his program and for VMI.

Bartlett is a 1970 graduate of SUNY-Geneseo, where he started on the lacrosse team for four years. He previously coached at Radford University, first as an assistant and then as head coach.

He is the father of three daughters – Jessie (16), Kelsey (13) and Maiah (10).

Every great coach needs a right-hand man to do his "behind-the-scenes work." Doug Bartlett's right-hand man is Mic Grant, who begins his eighth season as VMI's defensive coordinator and his fourth with the title of associate head coach.

In 2001, Grant was named the recruiting coordinator and became more heavily involved with the program's budget management. Since then, VMI has brought in three of the biggest and most talented recruiting classes in the program's history.

"I think that this promotion and additional responsibilities exemplifies Mic's commitment of positive contributions to the program," said Bartlett. "This is certainly a statement of appreciation for what Mic has done for VMI lacrosse."

Grant came to VMI from Hampden-Sydney College, where he was an assistant coach for five seasons under Ray Rostan. While at H-SC, Grant worked with the Tiger defensemen, monitored academic progress, scouted opponents, and assisted with recruiting. During that period, six of his players were named All-Americans.

Grant also has extensive experience as a lacrosse camp clinician, working at camps in Baltimore and Charlottesville, as well as in the Hampden-Sydney area.

As a player, Grant was a two-year lacrosse letterwinner at Hampden-Sydney, where he captained the squad during 1991, his senior season. He played his first two seasons of collegiate lacrosse at Ohio Wesleyan University, where he was a member of the Battling Bishops' 1988 and 1989 NCAA Division III National Finalist teams. He played in the Division III North/South Senior All-Star game in 1991.

A native of Charlottesville, Va., Grant was a first team All-American and first team All-State defenseman at St. Anne's-Belfield School in Charlottesville. As a senior at STAB, he was the men's lacrosse team MVP.

Grant is married to the former Heather Jenkins. The couple resides in Lexington.

Coming into his first season at the Institute is 2004 Keuka (NY) College graduate Nat St. Laurent. His main responsibilities will come with the Keydet offense, while assisting in many other aspects of the program.

"We're very excited to be able to bring somebody like Nat in," said head coach Doug Bartlett. "He has great experience, seeing the game played at a high level both scholastically and collegiately. We're looking forward to all that he will bring to the team this season."

St. Laurent began his collegiate career at Lasell College in Newton, Mass., where he was named team captain as a freshman following a standout high school career at national power Carthage High School. While at Carthage, St. Laurent played with many of the biggest names in lacrosse, including Mike and Ryan Powell, Jason and Josh Coffman and Eric Wood, to name a few.

After one season at Lasell, he moved on to Jefferson Community College in Watertown, N.Y. At Jefferson, he was named Honorable Mention All-Region after leading the team in scoring as the Cannoneers made it to the national tournament.

Injuries limited his playing time to only three games at Keuka, where he graduated from this past spring.

St. Laurent has worked many summer camps, including the Lacrosse Academy camp in Lexington and Special Olympics and elementary school camps back in New York.

St. Laurent comes to Lexington after finishing up an Elementary and Special Education degree that he currently uses as a sixth grade special education teacher at Parry McCluer Middle School in Buena Vista. He is an instructor in the 80th infantry division of the Army Reserve based out of Salem, Va., and is in the process of getting an officer's commission. He and his wife to be, Cristin Cavanaugh, reside in Lexington.
