HUNGRY FOR MORE

Following a breakthrough 2007 season, this year's Keydets are motivated to show that last year's success was no fluke, while continuing the chase for the program's first Big South Conference Championship and NCAA Tournament bid.

Wins over a pair of top-ten opponents. The program's first-ever national ranking. A series win at an SEC school on opening weekend for the second-straight season. An unprecedented run of 12 wins in 13 games. All of the above added up to what has been regarded as the greatest season in VMI Baseball history, when the Keydets broke the school record for wins once again, going 34-21 in 2007. However, it now falls to this year's squad to back up last year's success and show the college baseball world that 2007 was more than a fluke, but the start of a lasting trend in Lexington.

The 2008 Keydets should be well-armed to prove that is the case. The pitching staff returns all 55 starts and nearly 75% of last season's innings pitched, including junior Michael Bowman and senior Trey Barham anchoring the weekend rotation. Offensively, the Keydet lineup will be young but experienced, with juniors A.J. Yoder, Mike Roberts and redshirt-senior Thane Smith pacing the attack.

"Mike had both a great summer and a great fall, coming off a season that saw him catch 53 games," said VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry. "He's definitely our number one behind the dish this season. Mike will have the opportunity to improve his power numbers, and we're looking for him to be more consistent offensively. He is one of our team captains, so we'll be counting on his experience and leadership behind the plate and in the lineup to help guide our young guys."

Developing depth behind the plate will be another important step in the process, and Ikenberry has added several options in this year's recruiting class to address the issue. Alex Haitzuka enters the season as the second option behind the plate, while Justin Topping will also be in the mix at catcher, as well as in the outfield and at designated hitter.

"Alex and Justin were great high school hitters, and making the transition to the college game will happen with the experience that they gain in the early non-conference season," said Ikenberry. "Justin has a chance to be our starting designated hitter from day one and could see time in leftfield against left-handed pitching. Alex is outstanding behind the plate and has worked with all of our top pitchers this fall. He'll get an opportunity to play a lot as a freshman, which should only make Mike more productive throughout the season."

Infield

Familiar faces in unfamiliar places may be a theme for the Keydet infield. Junior A.J. Yoder, who has seen considerable time at both second and third base in his VMI career, is slated to take over the duties at shortstop, while sophomore Jordan Ballard will make the shift across the diamond from

third base to first base. That opens the third base starting spot for sophomore Tanner Biagini, while senior Shane Geisslinger returns for his fourth season starting at second base.

"We bring a good amount of experience back in the infield, especially up the middle," said Ikenberry. "A.J. has proven this fall that he can make the transition to shortstop after playing around the infield the first two years. We've had success in the past with Chad Rice '07 moving from second base to shortstop, and now we expect the same thing with A.J. We'll also look for A.J. to hit at the top of the lineup once again, where he's proven to be one of our top contact hitters and as one of the toughest batters in the nation to strike out. Shane is our best defensive second baseman, and we expect him to have an outstanding senior year. On the corners, both Tanner and Jordan got good experience as freshmen, and I expect both of them to have better offensive years. They both have the ability to hit for average and power and to be consistent college hitters."

Several freshmen will contribute to depth in the infield. Graham Sullivan will begin the season as the top backup at both corner infield positions, while Ryan Barefoot is penciled in as Yoder's backup at shortstop. Several options exist at second base, where Brett Entz and Austin Benda could see time. Meanwhile, Sam Roberts and Adam Kruihof, both of whom will be utilized on the mound this season, will team Phillip Steinhoff to backup Ballard at first base.

Outfield

The Keydet outfield returns three players that started at least 24 games a season ago, despite bidding farewell to two full-time starters. Redshirt-senior Thane Smith will lend experience and leadership to the group after hitting .289 in 44 starts a season ago. He'll be slated to start in either leftfield or centerfield, while sophomore Justin Hess, who saw action in 39 games as a freshman, will most likely be the team's opening day starter in centerfield. In rightfield, redshirt-sophomore Brian Sandridge, who came on strong down the stretch last season, and freshman Sam Roberts begin the season as the top options.

"We have a lot of flexibility in what we're going to be able to do in the outfield this season," said Ikenberry. "We'll count on Thane to be in the lineup everyday, and Justin showed what he can do late last season, hitting .382 in Conference

play. Brian and Sam give us different options in right, and then we've got several many other guys that will be pushing for time at all three spots. As long as David Lottman's arm stays healthy, he'll see time in leftfield. Colin Miller is a freshman that could see time in centerfield this year. Kyle Rucker showed tremendous power this fall, and as a redshirt freshman needs to get some experience playing this spring. And Hunter Naff is another redshirt freshmen that we expect to see on the field, most likely in left. Offensively, we should benefit from the group we have in the outfield, and the number of looks that we can throw out there from day-to-day."

Designated Hitter

The designated hitter spot is wide open entering opening day. Several of the previously mentioned freshmen will most likely see time early in the season at the role. In addition to redshirt-sophomore Matt Edwards, right-handed options include Justin Topping, Adam Kruithof, Kyle Rucker and Graham Sullivan, while from the left-side, options include Sam Roberts, David Lottman and Hunter Naff.

"There will be quite a bit of competition at designated hitter early this season, and that's a good thing for us," said Ikenberry. "A lot of guys will have an opportunity to prove themselves, and we'll just go with what is working. Right now, Justin Topping and Matt Edwards have a good shot at opening the season in that role, and what we're looking for is to see somebody take to the role like Brian Sandridge did last year, when he came up with some big hits for us down the stretch."

a .235 opposing batting average and 2.73 ERA. This preseason, Bowman has been featured on the Ping! Baseball Third Team All-Ping Team, on the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List, and he was the runner-up for Big South Preseason Pitcher of the Year.

Barham enters his senior season as the career wins leader in VMI history, bringing an 18-11 record into 2008. A season ago, Barham went 9-5 with a 3.09 ERA, as the Keydets went 11-4 in his 15 starts. Perhaps the top southpaw in the Big South, Barham will be looking to go out with a bang in his final campaign on post.

Sophomore Chris Duty, after being thrown into the fire as a freshman, will be expected to take the ball on Sundays. Duty saw time in the weekend rotation, as a mid-week starter and out of the bullpen a season ago. He went 3-0 in his first four collegiate starts, including a win in his first Big South start, a two-run outing at Charleston Southern. On the season, he went 5-3 with a 5.43 ERA, with opponents hitting only .265 off of the right-hander.

"We feel very good with our weekend rotation right now," said Ikenberry. "Bowman, Barham and Duty give us a great right-left-right combination on the weekend. Bowman's year last year solidified him as a top starter in the

League and nationally. He's going to be a guy that can match up against anybody's #1 across the country. He's got a great fastball, he's a three-pitch guy, and he knows how to compete. Barham gives us a fantastic Saturday guy who can also pitch on Fridays for us. He'll continue to get us late into games like he has for the past two years. Duty pitched in the weekend rotation early last season, and his resilience should be better this year. He took the summer off and came out looking great this fall. We're looking for him to have a great season."

The team will look to freshmen to fill in the mid-week starting spots, as lefthanders Matt "Lefty" Flora and Jason Farley will be the prime candidates entering the season, while righthander Adam Kruithof may be an option as well.

"As far as the mid-week starts go, Flora and Farley look like the top guys right now," said Ikenberry. "Flora had a great fall for us. He has the ability to throw three pitches for strikes and should be able to keep hitters off balance. Farley gives us another left-hander in the rotation, and he's a great competitor has who made a great transition from high school to college already."

Relief Pitching

A trio of impressive arms return to the bullpen in 2008 as the staff looks to remake the relief corps. Junior Chris Henderson worked his way into the weekend rotation as a sophomore, seeing a great deal of success, but will move to the closer role this season. In addition, redshirt sophomores Travis Smink and Matt Edwards are expected to be back in the fold sometime in March after each underwent Tommy John surgery last season.

"We're really excited about the depth that we have out in the bullpen," said Ikenberry. "We've got some great arms coming back healthy in Smink and Edwards, and Chris Henderson has a great mindset for the closer role. He's a kid that's not going to back down from anybody, and we think he's the best guy we have to get three-to-six outs to finish a ballgame right now."

Returning to the bullpen from last season are sophomore sidewinders Daniel Wood (LHP) and Josh McPherson (RHP). Each flashed their potential at times last season, and could see expanded roles this season.

Several freshmen could see time as utility players both on the mound and in the field this season, including righthanders Adam Kruithof, Sam Roberts and Ryan Barefoot. From the left side, freshman Tim Brust will see time, as well as 6-foot-7 fifth-year senior Matt Murrer. Murrer, who wrapped up his four-year basketball career for the Keydets last season, joined the program last spring and could become a potent weapon for the team down the stretch.

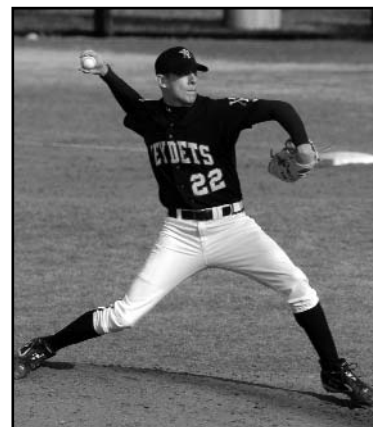
