VMI Looks For Substantial Improvement in 06-07 Campaign

Next year is finally here.

Few college basketball teams have anticipated the 2006-07 season more than VMI. Last year, the Keydets endured many trials and tribulations on their way to posting a 7-20 overall mark.

And yet, Coach Duggar Baucom's debut squad exhibited many qualities you would expect from a program establishing a solid foundation. The Keydets were competitive in nearly every game and exhibited the hustle and teamwork that Baucom had been preaching since the first day of taking the head coaching job. Key statistics such as assists, steals, shooting percentage, and scoring were all improved from the previous season.

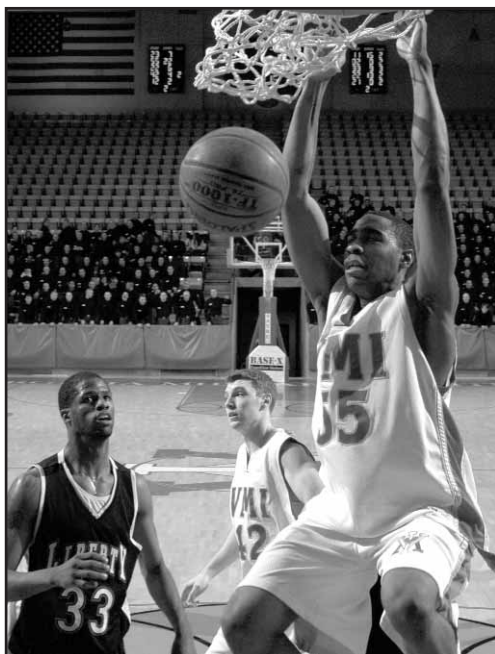
This season, VMI looks to improve the win statistic.

After opening up last season by dropping its first four games, VMI caught fire by reeling off five straight wins. On the eve of conference play in January, roster attrition and a surgical procedure that sidelined Baucom for seven conference games took its toll in the second half of the season.

But the Keydets lose just two seniors off last year's team and look to improve with 10 returning lettermen and four starters returning to the mix. Four freshmen have been added to fill the gaps. The players have absorbed Baucom's up-tempo style of play and the team looks to this coming season with desire to prove that it can make an upward move in the Big South Conference standings.

VMI returns two premiere players in the league, junior forward Reggie Williams (Prince George, Va.) and senior forward Matt Murrer (Richmond, Va.).

Williams, a returning all-conference performer who enters the season ranked as the 16th best small forward in college basketball according to a college scouting report can play with the best and has performed at a high level throughout his career. Williams has all the skills and has been a solid foundation to the team with his scoring, rebounding, and defense. Throughout his career, Williams has scored in double figures in 46 of 54 career games and has 17 career 20-point games and last season led the team with a 19.0 scoring average and was second on the team with a 7.0 rebound average.

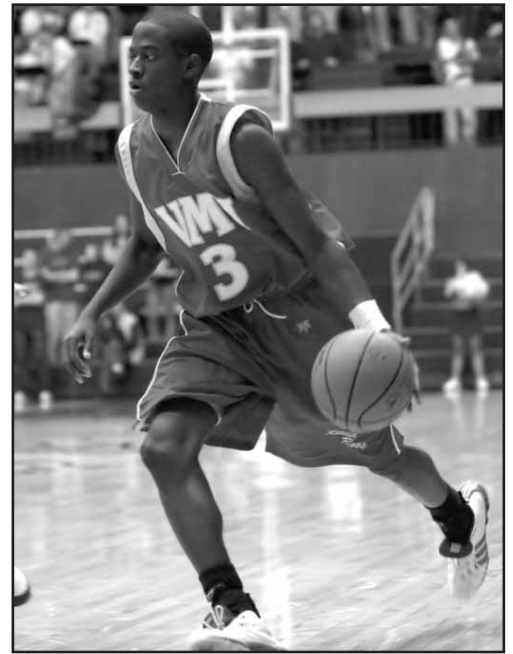


Reggie Williams

Williams was a second-team All-Big South in 2005-06 and ranked 3rd in the Big South in scoring, 5th in rebounding, 11th in FG%, 8th in FT%, 14th in 3-pt. pct He scored in double figures in 24 of 27 games including 17 straight contests, and had 10 20-point games on the season.

Murrer will compliment Williams again for the Keydets 1-2 scoring and rebounding combination. A returning starter who has developed into a complete player through hard

work, conditioning and experience, Murrer should be one of the top forwards in the league and will be counted on for scoring and rebounding. The senior from Richmond has good shooting and ball handling skills and has bulked up to help him even more on the boards. Murrer led the team in rebounding with a 7.9 average and was second on the team in scoring with a 12.7 average. He ranked 15th in the Big South in scoring, 3rd in rebounding, 2nd in FG%, 10th in FT% and shot under

50% in a game only once in 27 games played. Murrer shot 66% against league foes and led VMI in rebounding in 15 of 27 games played. The lefty shooter produced six double-doubles last year and ranked as high as second in the nation in FG% during the season but did not qualify in the final stats because of attempts.

Developing a consistent third scorer will be one of the team goals of the coming season, but twin guards Chavis and Travis Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) proved in their freshman seasons that they can produce quality point numbers on the college level. Both have starting experience and could start again in the backcourt this season.

Chavis Holmes played in 27 games with 18 starts and started 12 straight games at point guard at one point of last season. Chavis, who averaged 8.8 points, led the team in assists with 77 and ranked in the league top 10 on the year and scored a career-high 20 points in the win against Army Dec. 8. Chavis was named New Balance Big South Freshman of the Week Dec. 12 when he averaged 12.6 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 3.6 assists over a three-game stretch.

Travis Holmes also earned New Balance Big South Freshman of the Week honors last season and has the ability to get the hot-hand and provided the Keydets plenty of scoring off the bench last year led the team in steals with 48 and was in the top five in the league all season On Jan. 9th, Holmes earned his conference freshman of the week honors after averaging 14.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 steals in two conference games for the Keydets. He also scored in double figures in 11 of the last 22 games.

Finding a dependable point guard will likely be the biggest challenge for the Keydets this season. The job was split into a committee system for most of the season after VMI's starting point guard (Matt Coward) departed school after three games into the schedule. Chavis Holmes, junior Sean Christiansen who made eight starts last season, and even Williams all took turns at the point, with Chavis seeing most of the minutes. The Keydets inked freshman Adam Lonon (Richmond, Va.) to help out at the point guard slot. Lonon, a 5-11, 175 point guard who played scholastically at

Steward School averaged 17.3 points as a senior with 4.0 steals and 3.8 assists per game. Lonon scored a career-high 42 points in a game last season and was a first team 2005-06 All-State selection.

The backcourt will be rounded out with returning starter senior Jack Castleberry, senior Fred Robinson, senior Levar Joseph, Christiansen, and sophomore Dusty Pflugner, along with signee Carl Josey.

Castleberry (Va. Beach, Va.) played in all but one game

and started 13 straight games at guard and finished with 18 total starts on the season and usually drew the tough defensive assignments during the season. Robinson (Alexandria, Va.), a pure shooter who has the ability to get hot and give the team a lift is looking forward to a big senior season after shooting 37% beyond the arc last season. Joseph (Vacherie, La.) has a good outside touch, but must rehab from a knee injury that sidelined him last year. Christiansen (Greenville, Pa.) can play either point or off-guard, and was second on the team last season in assists with 60. Pflugner, a tough competitor who prides himself on making a contribution through hustle and toughness will contribute to depth in the backcourt this season after playing his 18 games his freshman year.

Josey, a native of Surrey England who played at the King's Academy in Knoxville, Tenn., received the team's impact player award at The King's Academy his junior year and averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds a game. He is expected to make an immediate impact in the backcourt.

With the departure of senior post players Tadas Mankevicius and Preston Beverly from last year's team, developing a productive inside game will be a key priority of fall preseason practice.

Much of the void will fall on the shoulders of 6-9 junior center Justin Jarman (Shinnston, W.Va.) who will contend for a starting spot at center. Jarman has quick hands for a big man and can be a force on the boards and will be a big key for the Keydet front line this season if he can put up more scoring and rebounding numbers. 6-9 Freshman signee Lucas Jones (Murfreesboro, Tenn. Siegel) was a District 7-AAA and Region 4-AAA all-tournament selection for a team that went 32-6 and captured the Region 4-AAA championship and advanced to the state tournament. Jones averaged nine points and six rebounds a game and had 49 blocks his senior season and shot 49% from the floor.

6-5 sophomore Willie Bell (Newport News, Va.) as well as 6-7 freshman J.T. Piribek will add depth at forward. Bell, also a wide receiver for the Keydets, should join the team after the completion of football season and is an "agitator" on the boards who gave VMI some rebounding punch at crucial times last season. Piribek averaged 10 points and six rebounds as a senior at McIntosh high School in Peachtree City, Ga.

How eager are the Keydets to start the season? VMI will be playing its earliest opener in the program's history when it travels to Ohio State November 10 to participate in the Sportstime BCA Classic which will pit VMI against top national competition.

The eight-team BCA Classic is one of two regular season tourneys for the Keydets, who will also play in the third annual William & Mary Tip-Off Classic in Williamsburg. VMI will face Cornell for the first time since the

1990-91 season in the first round Friday, December 1, and will play either Jacksonville State or host William & Mary on Saturday, December 2.

The '06-'07 schedule will be the first time that a VMI basketball team has played in two regular season tournaments since the 1976-77 season when the Keydets played in three tourneys.

The 2006-07 features 13 regular season home games at Cameron Hall and two exhibitions. The Keydets will open the regular season home schedule on Wednesday, November 15 against Virginia Intermont and will follow with a home game against Southern Virginia on Monday, November 20.

The home slate also features visits from first-time opponents. Lees-McRae College will play the Keydets at Cameron Hall on December 6, followed by Mercer of the Atlantic Sun Conference on December 9. South Carolina State of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference wraps up the three-game homestand on December 11.

VMI will open its 14-game Big South conference schedule on January 6 at defending champion Winthrop. The Big South Conference Tournament will run from February 27 - March 3.

Other non-conference road tilts include James Madison (Nov. 22), Army (Nov. 28), Richmond (Dec. 20), and Penn State (Dec. 30).

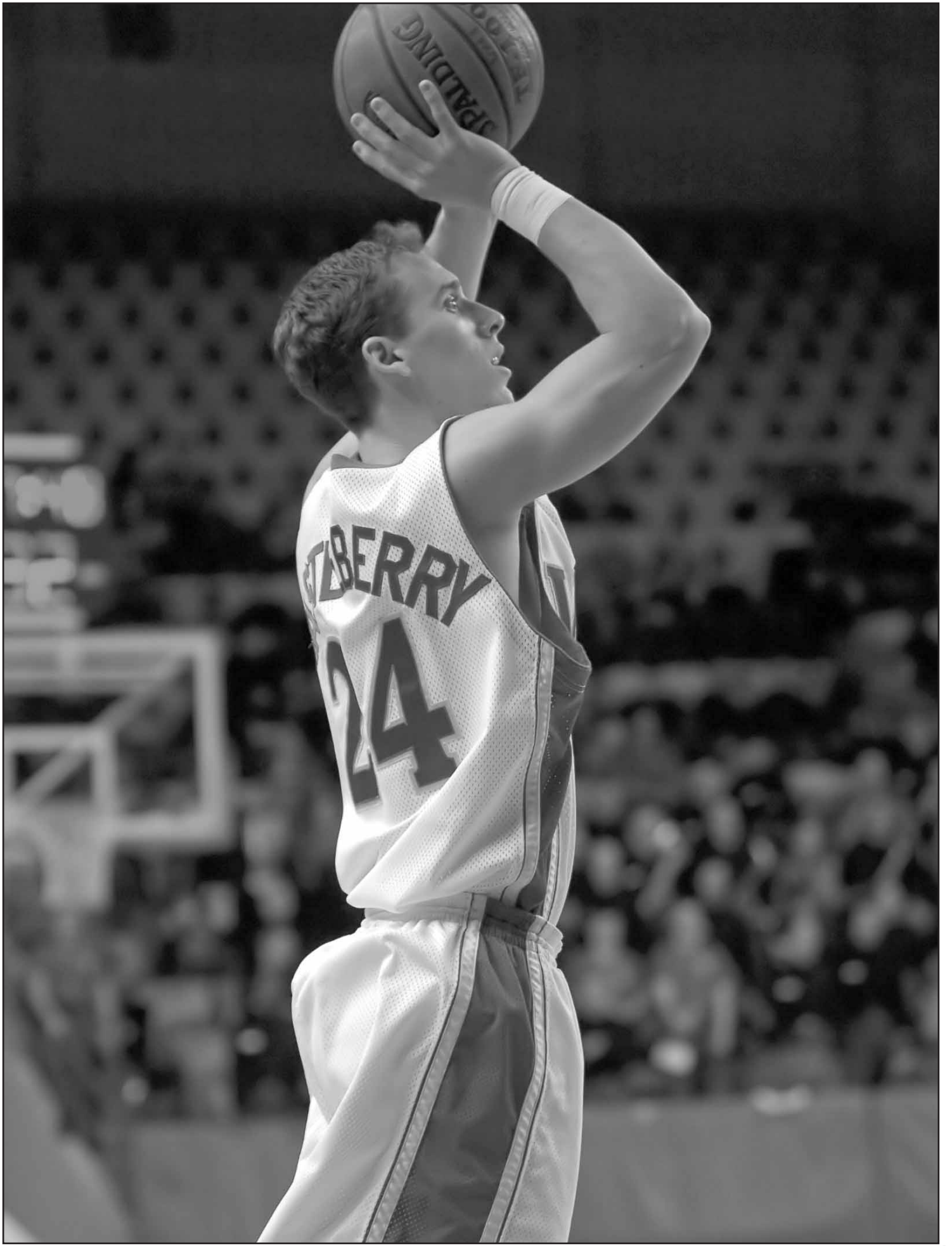

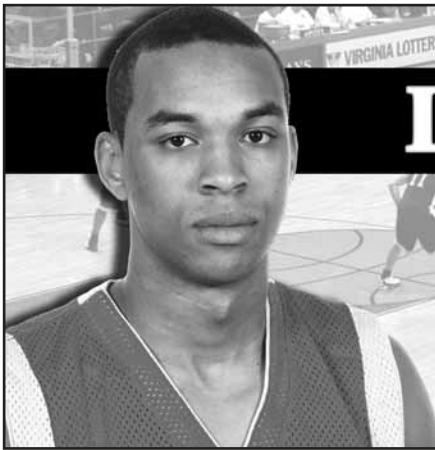

ON JOSEPH - Comes into the season as a question mark following a medical red-shirt last season...could give the VMI backcourt a big boost of he can regain the shooting form that he displayed his first three years...must stay healthy to contribute...one of four seniors on the team.

2005-06: Played in just five games and was shut down for the rest of the year to rehab a knee injury that sidelined him for part of the 2004-05 season as well...was granted a medical red-shirt...scored his first points of the season Dec. 10 against Southern Virginia (3 points)...Saw his first action of the season in game five against UVA-Wise Dec. 2 and played five minutes with no points... averaged just 4.0 minutes in his five games during the year.

2004-05: Was hit by the injury bug which limited his playing time...played in 14 of 27 games but averaged 9.4 points in the contests he played...twisted his knee in overtime against Longwood Dec. 8 which sidelined him a month and re-injured his knee at Coastal Carolina Feb. 5 which shut his season down...scored a season-high 19 points and hit four of nine three-pointers in the win over Virginia Tech Dec. 4...scored in double figures in seven of 14 games played...hit 35.7% of his three-point tries (25-70)...knocked down four of five shots from the floor against Charleston Southern Jan. 8...led VMI in scoring with 18 points in the win over Navy Nov. 28 when he hit four of nine three pointers.

2003-04: Started the season as the starting shooting guard but was ruled ineligible for the second semester...played in eight games and started the first five contests of the year...shot 42% from 3-point range (16-38)...scored in double figures three times including a career-high 27 points on 11-14 shooting against Eastern Mennonite Dec. 13...also hit 5 of 7 of 3-point attempts against EMC...scored 18 points at Virginia Tech Dec. 10 on 7-11 shooting from the floor and hit 4 of 7 beyond the arc...hit double figures with 12 points against UT-San Antonio.

2002-03: Hit 39.5% of his three-pointers which led the team statistically...played in 29 of 30 games with two starts...his top scoring games included 15 points against Eastern Mennonite Dec. 14, 14 points at Appalachian State Feb. 14, and 11 points vs. Georgia Southern Jan. 11...hit four three-pointers against Eastern Mennonite and Appalachian State...hit both three-point attempts against Davidson Jan. 21.

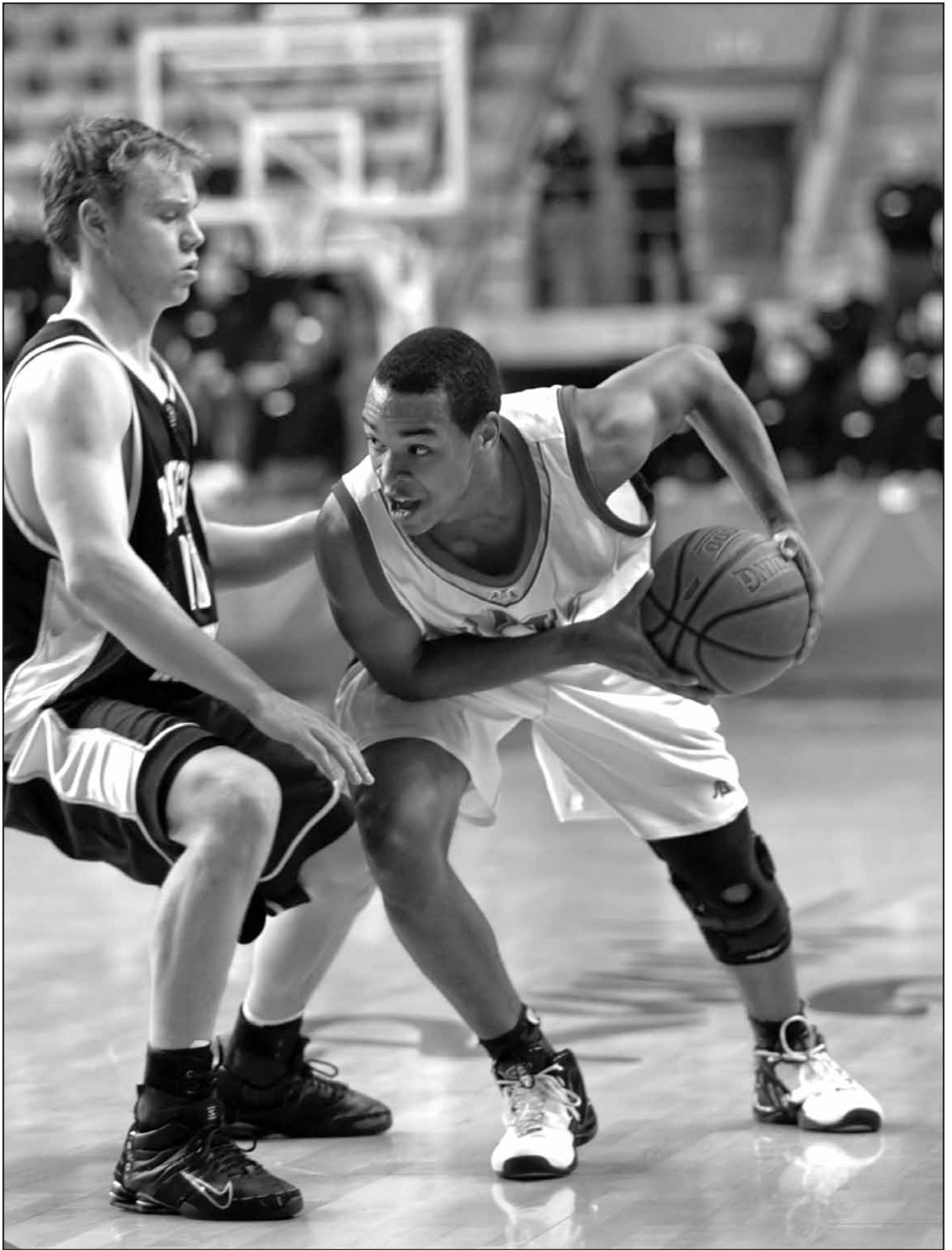

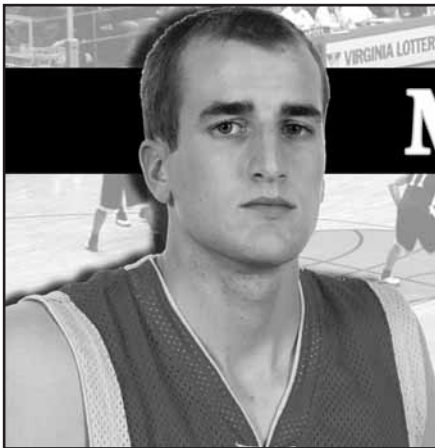

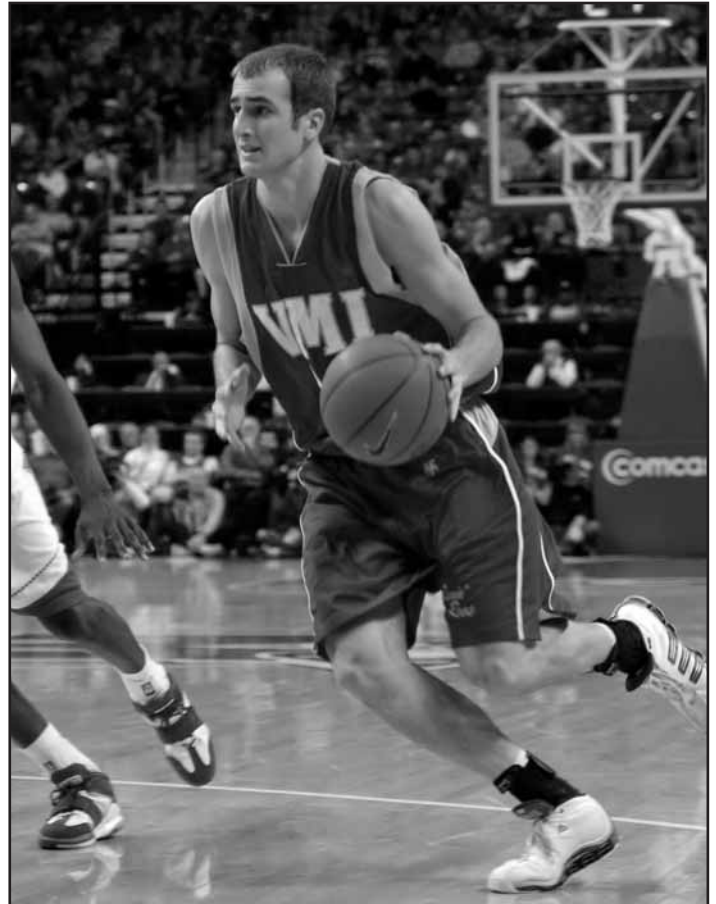

2005-06: Started 25 games at forward and played in all 27 games... led the team in rebounding with a 7.9 average and was second on the team in scoring with a 12.7 average... Ranked 15th in the Big South in scoring, 3rd in rebounding, 2nd in FG%, 10th in FT% ... Shot under 50% in a game only once in 27 games played ...shot 66% against league foes... Led VMI in rebounding in 15 of 27 games played ... Produced six double-doubles last year ... Ranked as high as second in the nation in FG% during the season but did not qualify in the final stats because of attempts ... Double-double games against League foes included a career-high 23 points (7-of-11 from floor), 11 rebounds against HPU, 15 points and career-high 15 rebounds against Winthrop Jan. 30, 12 points, 10 rebounds against Liberty Jan. 14 (7-of-8 from floor), 13 points, 10 rebounds against UNCA Feb. 11, and 12 points, 13 rebounds against High Point Feb. 15, and 12 points and 14 rebounds against Radford Feb. 23 ...
