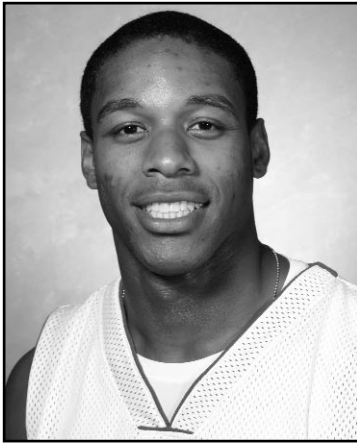

THREE-YEAR LETTERMAN/COMPUTER SCIENCE MAJOR

LAST SEASON - Recovered from knee surgery and a medical red-shirt season the previous year and had a productive campaign...led the team in rebounding with a 5.1 average...played in all 27 games with 10 starts...started eight of the last nine games...led VMI in rebounding in nine games during the season...scored a career-high 15 points with 10 rebounds against Bluefield Dec. 13 when he hit seven of 13 shots from the field...matched his career-high with 15 points at Coastal Carolina on five of six shooting...scored 10 points against Birmingham-Southern Jan. 29.

2003-04: Had season cut short by season ending knee surgery in December...Played in four of VMI's six games before shutting his season down...averaged 3.0 points and 3.0 rebounds...scored four points against Virginia and six points against Virginia Tech.

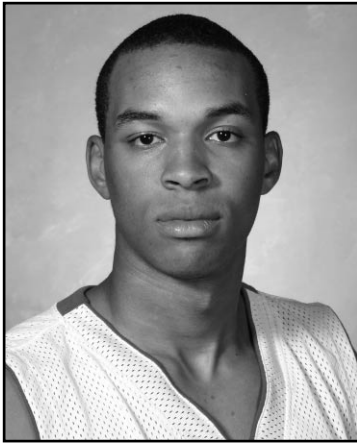

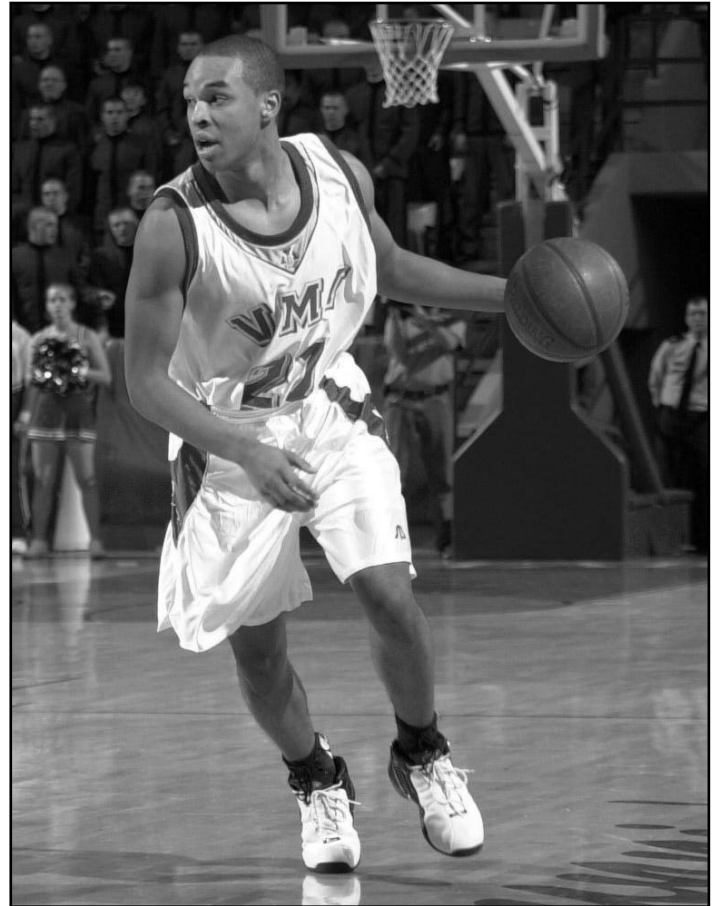
TWO-YEAR LETTRMAN/ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS MAJOR

LAST SEASON - Was hit by the injury bug which limited his playing time...played in 14 of 27 games but averaged 9.4 points in the contests he played...twisted his knee in overtime against Longwood Dec. 8 which sidelined him a month and re-injured his knee at Coastal Carolina Feb. 5 which shut his season down...scored a season-high 19 points and hit four of nine three-pointers in the win over Virginia Tech Dec. 4...scored in double figures in seven of 14 games played...hit 35.7% of his three-point tries (25-70)...knocked down four of five shots from the floor against Charleston Southern Jan. 8...led VMI in scoring with 18 points in the win over Navy Nov. 28 when he hit four of nine three pointers.

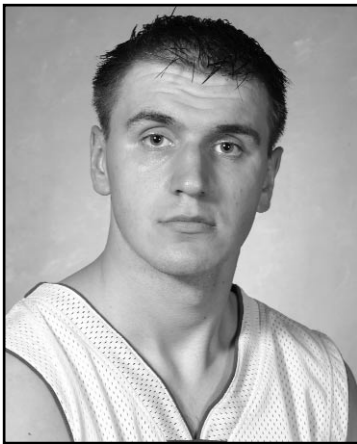

LAST SEASON – Recovered from injuries the previous year and played in all games ...appeared in 27 games with seven starts...scored a career-high points in 15 minutes in a reserve role in the win over Liberty Feb. 17...started the first five games of the season and later made starts against New Orleans and High Point...pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds in the season opener against Southern Virginia...hit four of five shots in an eight-point effort against High Point...pulled down five or more rebounds in five games.

2003-04: Battled through injury to contribute during the season...Played in 22 games with nine starts...Returned to the lineup Feb. 9 vs. JMU after missing six games with a broken bone in his right hand, but nearly broke his nose for the second time Feb. 21 against Liberty and had to again don his protective mask that he wore the first ten games of the year... Made his first start since Jan. 10 on Feb. 16 against Charleston Southern and scored nine points and had seven rebounds in 21 minutes played ... Prior to his broken hand injury Jan. 10 which sidelined him for six games, he grabbed a career-high eight rebounds against Louisville Dec. 23, then topped it with another career-high nine rebounds to go with his eight points in his first career start at center Dec. 29 vs. ODU. He averaged 7.2 rebounds over a five-game stretch in December/January and averaged 8.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in three starts when he moved into the starting lineup for the injured junior center Tim Allmond...Scored a season-high 10 points in back-to-back games against Radford in Winthrop in January...shooting 55.9% from the field (38-68)...named to the Big South's All-Academic team and had a 3.47 GPA in Economics and Business.

2002-03: Played in 29 of 30 games...averaged just over 8.0 minutes a contest...scored a season-high 11 points against East Tennessee State Jan. 18...scored eight points with four rebounds at Virginia Tech Dec. 5...pulled down a season-high six rebounds at Appalachian State Jan. 24...blocked two shots vs. Eastern Mennonite Dec. 14 and East Tennessee State Feb. 4...hit 7-9 free throws vs. East Tennessee State Jan. 18.
