Noting The Keydets

Keydets Earn All-Conference Accolades

Senior shortstop Chad Rice earned First Team All-Conference honors while senior first baseman Robert Crumpler and sophomore hurler Michael Bowman garnered Second Team All-Conference recognition, as the Big South Conference announced its annual awards.

Rice, who was also named to the League's All-Academic team, hit .279 in his senior campaign, leading the team with 11 stolen bases while posting career-bests with nine doubles and a .967 fielding percentage. Rice had a team-best 14-game hitting streak, and in all, reached base safely in 43 of the team's 55 games this season. Rice becomes the second Keydet shortstop to earn All-Conference honors in three years, joining 2005 honoree Matt Smith, who also won First Team honors in his senior campaign.

Crumpler was named Second Team All-Conference as he led the League in doubles (22) and slugging percentage (.655). The senior slugger also ranked second in the League with 14 home runs while placing in the top five in on-base percentage (.459), runs scored (55), RBI (52) and total bases (129). Crumpler, who earned Big South Player of the Week honors in mid-April, currently ranks in the school's career top ten in 14 different categories, including batting average, slugging percentage, hits, runs and RBI. Crumpler is the program's first honoree at first base since Ray Flowers earned Second Team honors as a member of the Southern Conference in 1992.

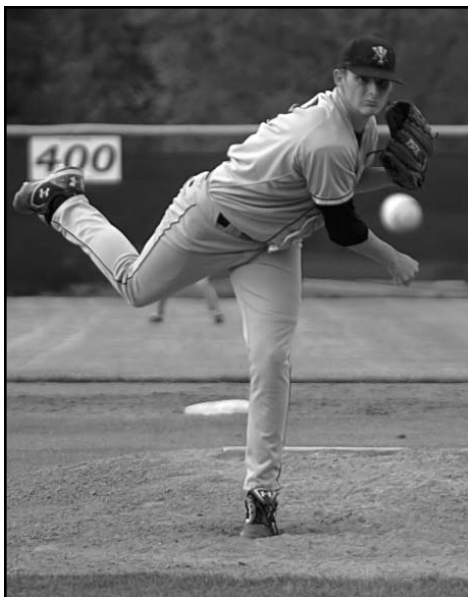
Bowman becomes the second Keydet pitcher in as many years to make the Conference's Second Team, joining Trey Barham who was so honored in 2006. Bowman ranked second in the Big South in strikeouts (110) and third in both ERA (2.73) and opposing batting average (.235), while his six wins also rank him among the top ten in the League.

Record-Setters Once Again

Once again, the 2007 VMI Keydets posted another record-breaking season, including their second-consecutive 30-win campaign, the first time the feat has ever been accomplished.

Individual:

* Robert Crumpler broke a three-way with a

single through the left-side of the infield against Coastal Carolina in his final collegiate game to break the single-season total bases record, collecting 129 in his senior campaign.

* On the pitching side, sophomore Michael Bowman broke a pair of school records with his performance against Liberty in the first game of the Big South Championship. With his eight-inning, eight-strikeout outing, Bowman posted 99.0 innings and 110 strikeouts, surpassing the school records of 97.2 innings (Phil Hendrix, 2003) and 106 strikeouts (Percy Sensabaugh, 1965).

Team:

* A trio of pitching marks fell, thanks to the team's 22 saves (also a new Big South record), five shutouts and 419 strikeouts posted. The old records stood at 12 saves (1993, 2006), four shutouts (2002) and 356 strikeouts (1998).

* With 112 doubles, the Keydets surpassed the previous school-record total of 111, established in 2000.

* The pitching staff posted a 3.94 ERA, which ranks as its lowest mark since the 1974 season. That year, the Keydets held a 3.83 mark, the school record since the introduction of the aluminum bat.

* With a ratio of 2.75, the Keydets held the fewest walks per nine innings in school history, besting the mark of 2.81 in 1977.

Honoring Our Seniors

For the third consecutive season, the graduating class of the VMI Baseball program has left as the winningest four-year class. The players included Corey Bachman, Ian Casher, Robert Crumpler, Jacoby Fields, John Goode and Chad Rice.

In their four years, the Keydets went 114-106. It marks the first time in 40 seasons that a class leaves the Institute with a winning record, since the 1967 senior class rang up a 34-33 mark.

Bowman and Crum Join Barham on Roger Clemens Award Watch List

Sophomores Michael Bowman and Kevin Crum were named to the Roger Clemens Award Watch List, joining junior teammate Trey Barham as announced by the Greater Houston Baseball Association. The Roger Clemens Award is given annually to the top pitcher in collegiate baseball.

Bowman wrapped up the season with a 6-3 record in his sophomore season, pacing the team with a 2.73 ERA, 110 strikeouts, 99.0 innings, an opposing batting average of .235, all while allowing only two home runs. The righthander also ranked second in the Big South in strikeouts, and third in opposing batting average and ERA.

Crum tied for the fourth-most saves in the country with 14, successfully converting 14 of his 19 save attempts. He established new VMI single-season and career marks as a sophomore. In Big South play, Crum went 3-0 with two saves in seven appearances.

Barham, who was added to the list upon earning Pitcher of the Week honors from the NCBWA on April 3, wrapped up his impressive junior campaign by leading the team with nine wins in his 14 starts. The Keydets held a 11-4 mark in games started by Barham, while he ranked second on the team with 79 strikeouts, 87.1 innings, and an ERA of 3.09. A Second Team All-Big South Conference selection a year ago, Barham also became the winningest pitch-

er in VMI history with his 18-11 career mark. Barham tied for the second-most wins in the Big South, while also ranking in the top ten in strikeouts and ERA.

Previous winners of the Roger Clemens Award were Jered Weaver of Long Beach State (2004), Luke Hochevar of Tennessee (2005) and Andrew Miller of North Carolina (2006).

Crum Named to Howser Watch List

For the second straight season, VMI boasted a player on the Dick Howser Award Watch List, as sophomore closer Kevin Crum was so honored by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association (NCBWA).

Crum, who tied for the fourth-most saves nationally with 14 saves, joins 2006 graduate Kelly Sweppenhiser, who was so honored in his senior campaign.

The Dick Howser Award is given annually by the NCBWA in conjunction with the St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce to the top player in collegiate baseball.

Another Record-Setting Season

With a series win over UNC Asheville in late April, the 2007 VMI baseball team broke the school's single-season record for wins by claiming their 31st triumph of the season. That marked the fourth time in five seasons that the feat has been accomplished. The team finished the season at 34-21, posting its second consecutive winning campaign.

Under head coach Tom Slater, the 2003 team went 25-27, breaking the 1999 mark of 22-27 to establish a new precedent. The 2004 team then fell just short under first-year head coach Marlin Ikenberry with a 23-32 record, before setting new totals of 27 wins in 2005, 30 wins in 2006 and now 34 in 2007.

Starting The Job Right

The VMI starting pitchers did an impressive job of getting games started the right way. In the team's 55 games, the starting staff a 26-13 record, combining for a 3.53 ERA.

When focused on the team's weekend starters, the numbers improve even more. The trio of Trey Barham, Michael Bowman and Chris Henderson combined for a 21-10 mark in their 43 starts, posting a combined 3.22 ERA and 225 strikeouts in 243 innings. Meanwhile, they walked only 67 batters in their starts, as opponents hit .261 against the trio.

Additionally, Barham and Bowman's name can be found all across the Big South leaderboard. Bowman ranked second in the League with 110 strikeouts and third with a .235 opposing batting average and a 2.73 ERA, while also ranking eighth with 99.0 innings pitched. Barham ranked second in the League with nine wins (tied), fourth in ERA (3.09) and sixth in strikeouts (79).

Four: The Keydets' Magic Number

For the Keydets in 2007, four runs was the magic number.

When VMI scored at least four runs in a game, the team went 30-7, while standing 4-14 when scoring less than four runs.

Meanwhile, the team was 22-0 when holding

opponents to less than four runs, 6-8 when allowing opponents four runs exactly and 6-13 when allowing more than four runs.

Barham Assaulting The Recordbooks

Trey Barham continued his march up the VMI career recordbooks in 2007. By pitching five innings against Coppin State, Barham collected his 17th career victory, setting a new school record previously held by Ian Ostlund, who won 16 games from 1998-00. He now stands at 18-11 in his three-year career at the Institute.

Barham's ERA of 3.68 entering his senior year ranks him third in school history, as does his strikeouts per nine innings ratio of 8.68. He also moved into the top ten in career strikeouts with three strikeouts in a relief appearance against VCU. He enters the year ranked third in that category with 205, while also ranking ninth with only 3.68 walks per nine innings in his career.

Ikenberry Winningest Keydet Skipper

With a 13-0 win against Coppin State in game one of a weekend series, VMI skipper Marlin Ikenberry became the school's all-time leader in coaching victories, surpassing Scott Gines' total of 104. His coaching record currently stands at 114-106.

The Friendly Confines

With a 23-7 home mark, the Keydets took care of business when opponents came to the friendly confines of Gray-Minor Stadium. In fact, after dropping an 8-1 decision to Niagara on Feb. 23, the team won 15 straight home games before falling 11-3 in the second game of a doubleheader against High Point on April 7. The 15-game home winning streak ranked as the fifth-longest in the nation when it was broken. Included in that run were weekend sweeps against Rider, Maryland-Eastern Shore and Savannah State, as well as mid-week wins against in-state opponents Norfolk State, VCU and #3 Virginia and wins in the two games against High Point.

The run also established a new school record for consecutive home wins with the run, besting a 12-game home winning streak in 2006.

Though Gray-Minor Stadium was new in 2007, the Keydets have called the current location of Patchin Field home since the 1988 season. Since then, the Keydets boast a 239-217-1 overall mark at the friendly confines entering 2008, including a remarkable 99-40 record over the past five seasons. Additionally, the Keydets are 61-27 in one-run games at Patchin.

Since taking over the helm of the VMI program before the 2004 campaign, head coach Marlin Ikenberry is 84-35 at home.

Keydets Hold Their Own In In-State Battles

In 2007, the Keydets experienced several impressive wins on their way to a school-record 34-21 mark. Included in those wins were ten over in-state rivals. Here is how all of the in-state teams fared against each other in '07:

Crumpler Crushing

Senior first baseman Robert Crumpler crushed opposing pitching all season, as he posted career highs in several categories.

Named Big South Conference Player of the Week for his series against Coppin State (.600, 3 2B, 2 HR, 1.500 SLG), Crumpler earned the honor for the third time in his career.

In his senior campaign, Crumpler collected 65 hits, including 29 singles, 22 doubles and 14 home runs. His doubles total ranked him second on VMI's single-season list, while his slugging percentage (.655) ranked seventh on the school's single-season list.

During a ten-game span, Crumpler collected hits in nine contests, hitting .444 (16-for-36) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 15 runs scored and 22 RBIs.

He led the Big South in doubles (22) and slugging percentage (.655), while ranking second in home runs (14), fourth in on-base percentage (.459) and fifth in RBI (52), runs scored (55-tied) and total bases (129).

The senior slugger also ranked in the top ten in VMI history in career batting average (.324), on-base percentage (.427), slugging percentage (.554),

Yoder Does It All

It doesn't matter where his name was written in on the batting order. It doesn't matter which position he's playing in the field. Sophomore A.J. Yoder hit the ball no matter what the situation. In fact, in the team's 55 games, Yoder had hits in 39 of them, reaching base more than once 32 times.

In his sophomore season, Yoder, who played both second and third base, led the team with four triples, ranked second on the team with a .410 OBP and ranked third on the team with a .439 SLG and 13 2B (tied).

VMI Sweeps Season Series with Rams

Secure that breaking a 16-game losing streak to VCU with a 5-3 win at home against the Rams on March 27 wasn't enough, the Keydets came back and swept the season series against the Rams by taking a 3-1 victory on April 24 at The Diamond.

The win, the Keydets' first over the Rams in Richmond since April 19, 1973, assured the Keydets of their first-ever season sweep in the series.

In the second win, the Keydets grabbed a 2-0 lead in the second inning on an RBI single from Brian Sandridge, followed by a run-scoring double off the bat of Shane Geisslinger. The Rams cut the margin to 2-1 off of starting pitcher Chris Duty in the seventh inning, however, saw their attempt to tie the game thwarted when the Keydets appealed to third base to see if the scoring runner had left early on a sacrifice fly, and were rewarded with an inning-ending double play to wrap up the seventh.

The Keydets tacked on an insurance run in the top of the eighth as Geisslinger scored on a fielder's choice, before Corey Bachman came on to record his fifth save of the season and give the Keydets their 29th win of the year.

Keydets Claim Historic Win Over #3 Virginia

Hosting the highest-ranked opponent to ever come to VMI for a baseball game, the Keydets made history once again, claiming a 5-2 win over #3 Virginia on April 3 at Gray-Minor Stadium.

Thanks in large part to sophomore hurler Chris Henderson, who claimed his third-consecutive mid-week win over an in-state opponent, the Keydets claimed revenge for a 5-3 loss in Charlottesville earlier in the year. A four-run sixth-inning off of reliever Jake Rule spelled the difference.

The win over #3 Virginia replaced a March win over #10 Auburn as the highest-ranked opponent that VMI has defeated in program history. The ranking was also the highest in Cavaliers' history, as they were tabbed #3 in both the Baseball America and USA Today/ESPN Top 25 polls.

Barham Earns National Honor

After a week that saw him allow only one hit in ten innings while striking out 11 batters, junior left-hander Trey Barham became the first player in program history to receive a National Pitcher of the Week Award, earning the honor from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association.

Barham collected his sixth win of the season on March 31, striking out eight batters while allowing only two baserunners in a 15-2 win against Savannah State. Just four days previous, Barham struck out three batters in two innings of relief against VCU in a 5-3 win. His line on the week was 1-0, 0.00 ERA, 10 IP, 1 H, 0 R/ER, 1 BB, 11 K, .031 opponents batting average (1-32).

The southpaw also became the first Keydet to be named to the Roger Clemens Watch List, given to the national collegiate pitcher of the year, sponsored by the Greater Houston Baseball Organization. He also earned Big South Conference Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time in his career.

Henderson Mows 'Em Down Mid-Week

In one of the most impressive stretches by a Keydet starting pitcher in recent years, sophomore hurler Chris Henderson earned victories in consecutive starts against Old Dominion, VCU and #3 Virginia, the final win leading him to earn Big South Conference Pitcher of the Week honors.

Against ODU, Henderson allowed only one run in 8.1 innings, as the Keydets took a 3-1 victory in Norfolk on Wednesday, Mar. 22. That win was the Keydets' first victory in 28 years against Old Dominion, winning for their first time in 20 tries against the Monarchs, dating back to April 10, 1979.

Just less than a week later, Henderson earned the W by allowing only two runs in 5.2 innings in the Gray-Minor Stadium Dedication Game, as the Keydets took a 5-3 win over VCU on Tuesday, March 27. It was VMI's first win in the series since Mar. 26, 1985, ending a 16-game losing streak.

The following Tuesday, #3 Virginia came into town for the first time since 1997, representing the highest-ranked opponent that VMI had ever hosted on the diamond. The Keydets scored a 5-2 win over the Cavaliers with Henderson pitching 7.2 innings, allowing two runs, as it marked the first time in six meetings that VMI triumphed in the series. It also marked the first Keydet win in the series since April 13, 1995.

Gray-Minor Dedicated with Win

With Sen. Elmon Gray '46, Gil Minor '63 and Bill Paulette '69 each on hand along with their families to dedicate both Gray-Minor Stadium and Paulette Hall, the Keydets got back on the winning side with a 5-3 victory against VCU on March 27.

Pre-game festivities included a private ceremony earlier in the afternoon in the Pogue Auditorium of the Marshall Library with the three benefactors and their families. Their contributions to VMI baseball and to the Institute were recounted and replicas of brass plaques that are affixed to the facilities carrying their names were unveiled. The dedication events then concluded with a photo of Gray, Minor, and Paulette with the baseball team along the first base line of Patchin Field. Paulette then tossed out the first pitch, with Minor acting as catcher and Gray at bat.

The Keydets fell behind early on a first-inning run by VCU before Thane Smith stroked a two-run single to give VMI a 2-1 lead in the second inning. The Keydets then tacked on three more runs in the middle innings behind starting pitcher Chris Henderson, before Kevin Crum came on to record his 14th save of the season and secure the win.

Keydets Earn Program's First Ranking

Propelled by a significant winning streak and a series win against Florida, the VMI baseball team earned its first-ever national ranking on Monday, March 12, as Collegiate Baseball tabbed the Keydets #30 in the nation. The ranking remained unchanged the following week, as the team also received votes in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Poll.

The ranking was the first for a VMI athletic team in a national poll since the lacrosse team cracked the top 25 in 1992.

With that ranking, the Keydets went 5-4, splitting with #10 Auburn, sweeping Charleston Southern in the team's Big South opener, defeating Old Dominion for the first time in 28 years before being swept on the road by Winthrop.

Crum Saves The Day

Sophomore Kevin Crum collected his 14th save of the season, working the ninth inning against VCU as the team scored a 5-3 victory in the Gray-Minor Stadium dedication game on March 27. Crum finished the season while ranking fourth (tied) nationally in the category.

The save extended his single-season record total at VMI, while it also adds to his school career-record total of 16. Of his 14 saves, seven required at least five outs, while he did not allow a hit in seven of his saves.

Keydets Prevail Against The SEC

In his four seasons at the helm of the VMI baseball program, Marlin Ikenberry has never shied away from taking on the big boys. Those games have paid off over the past two seasons, as VMI holds a 5-3 mark against the SEC since the beginning of 2006.

On the opening weekend of 2006, the Keydets took two of three at Auburn in their only games against the SEC of the year. In 2007, the Keydets again took two of three on opening weekend, this time against Florida, before splitting a two-game, mid-week series against Auburn in mid-March.

Keydets Christen Gray-Minor Stadium With Win

With a 10-2 victory against Bucknell on Feb.

20, the VMI baseball team celebrated Gray-Minor Stadium's opening day in style. Several firsts were achieved on opening day, with Trey Barham hurling the first pitch (a ball high) at 3:07 p.m. to Bucknell centerfielder Dane Grandizio.

The first baserunner was Robert Crumpler (HBP), while the first run was scored by Bucknell's Jason Buursma in the second inning.

The first double was hit by A.J. Yoder in the first inning, while the first roundtripper went to Thane Smith in the sixth inning, though he nearly took the honor in the third inning, missing a home run by two feet in centerfield, thanks to the extra five feet added to the outfield wall's height during the Stadium's construction.

Starting Off With A Bang, Again!

For the second straight season, the VMI baseball team took two out of three contests at an SEC park to open the season, this time doing so by taking games one and two at the University of Florida on Feb. 9-11.

The team's success in Gainesville followed the 2006 season's triumphs at Auburn, when the team took games two and three against the Tigers to claim their first-ever series win against an SEC opponent. In fact, the 8-5 win against Auburn on Feb. 4, 2006, was the team's first against a member of the SEC since April 5, 1922, when VMI no-hit South Carolina.

Opening Night Success....Finally

The Keydets were victorious on opening night of the 2007 season by claiming a 5-3 victory over Florida, the program's first-ever win over the Gators. It also marked the first time the Keydets had won on opening night since defeating Air Force on Feb. 11, 2000 in a game played in Tampa, Fla.

With a 7-4 win the following afternoon, the Keydets improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 1993 campaign, when the Keydets defeated North Carolina A&T and Duke to kick off the season. That team featured current VMI skipper Marlin Ikenberry as a sophomore catcher on a team that made a run to the Southern Conference Tournament Finals the following May.
