# LET IT BE KNOWN. VMI BASKETBALL IS ON THE MOVE.

**Coming within a three-point field goal of making the NCAA tournament last year, the Keydets enter 2007-08 hungry for the ultimate prize and return the firepower necessary to make another strong bid.**

VMI basketball enjoyed a record setting year in 2006-07. Using an up-tempo system that keyed on forcing turnovers and generating points, the Keydets doubled their output in wins (14) from the previous year and racked up the most victories in nine years while advancing to the championship game of the Big South Tournament. VMI also set new NCAA season marks in three-pointers, both made and attempted (442 of 1383), 3-pointers made and attempted per game (13.4 and 41.9) and total steals (490).

The Keydets were also declared the 2006-07 stat champion in four team categories and two individual categories. VMI ranked first in Division I in scoring offense (100.9 PPG), three point field goals (13.4) made per game, assists per game (14.8), and steals per game (13.4).

Individually, junior forward Reggie Williams was declared the scoring champion in Division I after averaging 28.1 points per game. Sophomore guard Travis Holmes captured the steals per game statistical championship with 3.4 per game.

"I am very proud of our guys," said head coach Duggar Baucom. "Playing together as a team and with a lot of heart they accomplished some very memorable feats last year. Congratulations goes to Reggie and Travis on their achievements. They both had awesome years and would be the first to say that their teammates played a large role in their individual accomplishments."

In 2007-08, VMI returns seven players from last year's team including three players who accounted for nearly 80% of the offensive output. Three-year starting forward and graduated Matt Murrer will be missed with his 15.6 PPG and 5.8 RPG and gritty guard Jack Castleberry gave team needed floor leadership, while guard Fred Robinson provided outside shooting prowess, but there will be plenty of new faces in the mix as six newcomers join the program to find their roles.

Will VMI this season play the same kind of high-octane, frenetic pace that led the program to national recognition last year? Baucom has indicated that a modified system would be employed this year as efforts are made to develop newcomer depth to support the in-house scoring arsenal already in place.

But Baucom's teams have always been known for high-scoring output, having had five players averaging double-figures scoring in two of his first four years as a college head coach. The Keydets should again be pushing it up the floor again in the share-the-ball system that has produced eye-popping numbers.

Leading the charge will be 6-6 senior forward Reggie Williams (Prince George, Va.) who has emerged as one of the nation's elite small forwards while ranking atop the scoring charts. In fact, earlier this fall Williams was included among the preseason candidates for the John R. Wooden Award, regarded as the nation's most coveted college basketball award.

Williams put together a stellar junior season and thrived in VMI's up-tempo system. His numbers rose as VMI's offensive output soared, but Williams still accounted for a similar percentage of the Keydet offensive production as he did in his first two seasons, while also leading the team in scoring for the third-consecutive season.

Williams showed his versatility by ranked in the top four in the conference in points (1st), rebounding (4th), FG% (3rd), and assists (3rd) and also ranked 9th in the Big South in FT% and 10th in steals. Last year, Williams set new Big South and VMI records for most points in a season and is on track to become the all-time leading scorer in Big South history, supplanting Liberty's Larry Blair. A remarkable model of consistency, Williams became the first player in Big South Conference history to log three 40-point games in a career and topped 40+ points in four games last season while logging nine double-

doubles on the year.

The twin-brother scoring tandem of 6-4 guards Travis and Chavis Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) will once again complement the point production of Williams.

Travis Holmes stepped up his level of play last season, especially in the tournament stretch run, where he earned All-Tournament honors and helped the Keydets to the finals. A versatile performer who was one of VMI's two NCAA statistical champions after leading the nation in steals (111) and steals per game (3.4). T. Holmes had nine games with five or more steals, including eight against CSU 1/13, seven against UNCA 1/22, and six each against Winthrop 1/6 and Liberty 1/27. In scoring, T. Holmes was equally adept and ranked ninth in the BSC in points per game (15.0) and had 24 double figure scoring games, including a stretch of 15 straight contests (16.6 ppg).

Chavis Holmes has developed into an accurate sharpshooter who has extended his range throughout his college career and will be counted on again for dependable scoring around the perimeter. The numbers speak for themselves - C. Holmes led the Big South in 3-pointers made per game and was 10th nationally. He ranked second in the BSC in steals and was tied for fourth on the national level and also ranked fourth in the Big South in scoring

(19.2) and sixth in FT % (.744). Chavis Holmes also ranked second in the Big South with a .390 3FG percentage and 15 games with 20 or more points. The Keydets should benefit from his outside production if he can match a performance like last year, where he hit four or more 3FGs in 17 games during the season and scored in double-figures in 25 straight games.

Sophomore Adam Lonon (Richmond, Va.) is the returning starting point guard and matured greatly as a leader as his freshman year progressed. Lonon was the team's only true point guard last season and will be asked to step up in all areas this year. Lonon played in all 33 games with 31 starts at the point and dished out a season-high 11 assists in a record-setting win against Virginia Intermont, while also posting 10 assists against Lees-McRae. Lonon also ranked eighth in the Big South in assists (3.64) and was sixth in assist-turnover ratio and one of five Keydets to rank among the top 13 in steals in league games.

Junior forward Willie Bell (Newport News, Va.) will turn all his energies to basketball after playing both football and basketball his first two seasons and should continue to improve his level of play after a full year of conditioning and drills work in basketball. An outstanding athlete, Bell joined the team last November just days after catching a 17-yard touchdown pass in the football season finale against Liberty. In his season debut, Bell scored nine points and grabbed three rebounds against James Madison on Nov. 22, then started three nights later and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds at Howard on Nov. 25. He played perhaps his best game at UNC Asheville where he scored 11 points and grabbed

seven rebounds in the conference win, and it will be such performances the Keydets will need to overcome the departure of the graduated Murrer.

Sophomore 6-5 forward Carl Josey (Surry, England) played sparingly last season as a freshman, while showing promise in spells. His development in the strength and conditioning department could help the depth situation at the wing for the team. Josey has good range on his jumper and is VMI's third foreign-born player to join the hoops program in its basketball history. Other bench help could come from 6-4 junior forward Nick Matson (Roseville, Ca.), who joined the team at mid-season last year and continues to show steady improvement.

One of the largest hoops recruiting classes ever to attend VMI will take the floor in 2007-08, and developing depth will be a key priority in pre-season practice. The signees include frontliners Quinn Brownfield (6-7, 195, Katy, Texas), Hunter Houston (6-6, 195, Birmingham, Ala.), and the programs first seven-footer, Stephen Sargent (Fayetteville, Ga.).

Backcourt help among the freshman could come from 5-11 point guard Austin Kenon (Virginia Beach, Va.), 6-2 shooting guard Christian Hunter (Chagrin Falls, Ohio), and 5-6 point guard Joey Cantafio (Richmond, Va.), who is the son of former VMI head coach Joe Cantafio who directed the Keydets from 1987 through 1994.

VMI will open the season at the Air Force Classic Tournament in Colorado Springs, Colorado and will have D-1 non-conference tilts against Ohio State, James Madison, Army, South Carolina State, William & Mary, Richmond, and Mercer. The Keydets will open the 14-game Big South schedule Jan. 12 at Charleston Southern.

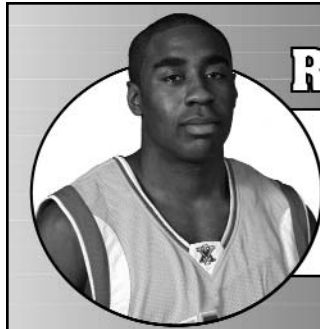

### THREE-YEAR LETTERMAN/PSYCHOLOGY MAJOR

**ON WILLIAMS-** One of the top returning scorers in the nation and is on track to become the all-time leading scorer in Big South history...climbed from 30th to third on the VMI career scoring list and has 1,861 points...has drawn attention from pro scouts with his slashing style of play and scoring ability...named to the 2007-08 Wooden Award Preseason List, becoming the first VMI player named to the list and the only Big South player to do so this season...on track to also grab the school record in career scoring average...has 17 career 30-point games which leads the school career charts and has scored 20 or more points in a game 43 times...expected to wrap up his outstanding VMI career with another record breaking season...voted to all-conference preseason squad.

**2006-07:** Led Division I in scoring with a 28.1 PPG average and averaged 30.5 points in conference games ... Ranked in the top four in the conference in points (1st), rebounding (4th), FG% (3rd), and assists (3rd) ... Also ranked 9th in the BSC in FT% and 10th in steals ... Set new Big South and VMI records for most points in a season ... # Player Development



Coach Duggar Baucom and his staff are dedicated to developing the cadet-athlete to his fullest potential in both individual and team practice settings. Basketball skills including shooting, ball-handling, defense, and team play are developed through countless hours of hard work put in by players and coaches of VMI Basketball.

Conditioning is a key component to the success of the basketball program, and VMI prides itself on providing the cadet-athlete with the tools to improve oneself physically. With over 9,000 square feet of space, the Charles S. Luck '20 Memorial Weight Room, located in Cocke Hall, contains over 17,000 pounds of free weights and 3,000 pounds of dumbbell weights. Over 70 pieces of free weight training equipment are available and over 40 separate pieces of resistive training machine-type equipment. Additional Olympic platforms, heavy duty power racks and a number of back, leg, and neck machines have been installed to complement existing equipment.





The Academic Advising Office provides academic support to all NCAA athletes in a variety of functions. The office, located in Miller Academic Center in Carroll Hall, assists athletes with the identification of individual career goals and selection of an academic major, and also maintains the tutoring program.

The Academic Advising staff mentors the cadet-athlete throughout the cadetship, and devotes all resources to continued progress toward degree completion and successful employment upon graduation.

The Academic Advising Office is currently staffed by **Sherry E. Baucom**, who also serves as the VMI Senior Woman Administrator, **Stephen T. Ross**, former VMI head men's soccer coach, and **Col. Donald K. Jamison**, professor emeritus of Civil Engineering and former VMI head tennis coach.
