In Review

Record Breakers

At the conclusion of perhaps the program's best season ever, the 2005 Keydets laid claim to numerous school records, both individual and team. Among the records that fell in 2005:

TEAM

*** School Record for Wins-** In 2003, VMI won 24 games before being awarded a forfeit victory over Radford later that summer to establish a new school mark of 25. In 2005, VMI broke that mark with 27 victories.

*** Landmark Wins-** The Keydets' win in late March over #21 Coastal Carolina marks the highest-ranked opponent VMI had defeated in over a decade, while their win over Virginia Tech in late April was VMI's first win over the Hokies since 1987, breaking an 11-game losing streak.

*** Senior Wins-** The 2005 senior class, consisting of nine players, left the Institute with the most wins in a four-year period in school history with 85.

*** 20-20-20-** For the first time in school history, the Keydets posted 20-win seasons in three consecutive years. The team's breakthrough came in 2003, when the Keydets posted 24 (later 25) wins to establish the school record. They almost matched that total a year later with 23 wins, and scored 27 in 2005 while taking on the likes of some of the best teams in the country in Florida State, Auburn, Vanderbilt and Virginia.

*** Hits-** In 55 contests, VMI pounded out 541 hits, breaking the school record total of 505 established in 2004.

INDIVIDUAL

*** Single-Season Hits & Total Bases-** Junior third baseman Kelly Sweppenhiser tied the school record of 128 total bases just three total bases and five hits in order to break the single-season records of 128 and 76, respectively. Last season, Sweppenhiser lead VMI in nine offensive categories, while ranking third in the Big South with a .370 batting average and ranking second in the league with 18 doubles.

*** Saves & Appearances-** Senior closer Jeff DeMara's name can now be found all over the VMI record books, as he took over the single-season and career appearances marks, as well as the career saves lead. In 2005 he tallied six saves, just one shy of the school record, while making 33 appearances, third most in the Big South.

*** Career Pitching Wins-** Seniors Duke Acors and Josh Owens each had three wins in '05, and along with their 10 wins previously, are tied for second for the most career wins at VMI with 13. Senior Jeff DeMara ranked just behind with 12 career wins and is tied for sixth most in school history.

*** Career Strikeouts & Innings Pitched-** In early 2005, senior Duke Acors took over the lead of two of the school's biggest pitching milestones, as he is now the leader in career strikeouts (245) and innings pitched (319.0).

*** Career Hits & Doubles-** Three Keydets assaulted these two categories, as each of them now rank among the top eight in each category. Senior Matt Smith lead the group in hits and ranks second all-time (tied) with 218, while com-

ing in seventh with 37 career doubles. Senior Elliott Erbe ranks fifth with 198 career hits and tied for fourth with 39 career doubles, while Kelly Sweppenhiser still has another year to build on his sixth-place total of 191 hits and eighth-place mark of 36 doubles, half of which came in '05.

*** Career Triples and RBI-** Senior Elliott Erbe moved into the top five in these two categories, compiling 137 RBI and eight triples, four of those coming in 2005, tied for the third-most in school history.

*** Career Stolen Bases-** Senior Matt Smith was the Keydet leadoff man for a reason, showing his speed with 11 stolen bases this season and moving up the fifth on the career thievery list. He currently has 38 in his four seasons at VMI.

Power at the Corners

Last season, the Keydets have been getting production out of the guys you would expect, their first and third basemen. Combined, junior third baseman Kelly Sweppenhiser (12) and sophomore first baseman Robert Crumpler (10) were the fourth-best HR hitting duo in the conference with 22 home runs, just behind Coastal's duo of Mike Costanzo (16) and Michael DeJesus (9). Winthrop's duo of Daniel Carte (19) and Jacob Dempsey (11) ranked second in the league while Birmingham-Southern's Adam Tucker, who had 25 by himself, and Brandon Hynick (9) combined for the most in the league. Sweppenhiser & Crumpler also rank 1-2 on the team in HR, RBI, batting average, total bases and slugging percentage.

Crumpler came on strong, as had 10 home runs on the year, along with 10 doubles, 43 RBI, a batting average of .319 and a slugging percentage of .515. He has also been doing it in the field, with several outstanding defensive plays at first base, while leading the team with a fielding percentage of .987.

Sweppenhiser continued to blow away pitchers, as he ranked in the top five in numerous statistical categories in the Big South, including doubles (18), on-base percentage (.494), slugging percentage (.640), total bases (128), home runs (12), and batting average (.370).

Robbing Them Blind

The Keydets were an impressive 80-108 in stolen base attempts this season, good enough for an 74.1% success rate. The top thief for VMI was B.T. Good, who went 17-for-20. Thane Smith was only thrown out twice, going 14-for-16 on stolen base attempts. Senior rightfielder Elliott Erbe ranked second on the team with 15 steals against seven caught stealings while senior leadoff hitter Matt Smith was only thrown out four times in 15 attempts.

Chicks Dig the Long Ball.....

.....And apparently so do the Keydets. VMI posted 39 home runs, last season, the fifth-most in the Big South Conference. Leading the way was third baseman Kelly Sweppenhiser with 12 and first baseman Robert Crumpler with 10. Eight of the nine regular starters for VMI hit a home run, while 11 Keydets in all have did so.

The Keydets were red hot on March 18,

when they lit up UNC Asheville's pitchers for five round-trippers alone. Sweppenhiser had two of them, while Klint Reed, Robert Crumpler and Jacoby Fields all went deep as well.

Erbe ranked third on the team with five this season, giving him 26 in his career. Klint Reed cranked out three, Matt Smith and Thane Smith each had two. Fields, B.T. Good, Stephen Parsons, Jaime Davis and Chase Buchanan each sent one beyond the fence as well.

Baseball in the Old Dominion

Thirteen NCAA Division I baseball teams call Virginia home, and VMI took on nine of them in '05. The Keydets went 11-7 against Old Dominion competition while getting at least one

victory over seven of the nine teams they faced. The Keydets' losses came in a 2-1 decision at Virginia in late March, a 12-6 loss to William & Mary in mid-April, a pair of losses to Liberty, a 9-2 decision to Old Dominion in early May and a pair of one-run losses to Radford at the end of the season. The Keydets victories came in a pair of mid-week games against Norfolk State, a 17-7 decision over Richmond, a three-game sweep of Longwood, an 8-6 win at home over William & Mary, a 6-2 road win over Virginia Tech, an 11-9 victory over Liberty and wins of 6-0 and 5-4 over Radford.

In the year-end Iterative Strength report issued by www.boydsworld.com, the Keydets had the sixth-highest rating among Virginia schools, ahead of William & Mary, James Madison, Radford, Old Dominion, Richmond, Longwood and Norfolk State. Leading the way among Virginia schools is Virginia, followed by Liberty, George Mason, VCU and Virginia Tech.

Closing the Deal

With a pair of saves against High Point in mid-May, senior reliever Jeff DeMara took over as the school's all-time career save leader with 13. DeMara passed Ian Ostlund, who pitched for three seasons at VMI, from 1998-2000, and stands as the Keydet leader in wins (16) in a career and now ranks second with 11 career saves.

DeMara also fell just short of the school's single-season saves record, as he finished the 2005 season with six, one behind Merlin Ikenberry's total in 1993 and Ian Ostlund's total in 1999.

DeMara became the all-time leader in career appearances on March 20 against UNC Asheville, pitching in his 84th contest as a Keydet.

With a win against Radford on May 21, DeMara claimed his 12th career victory. He is currently tied for seventh on the all-time career wins list at VMI.

Duke Acors: VMI Strikeout King

Senior starter Duke Acors became VMI's strikeout king on March 18, when he struck out a season-high nine batters to surpass Phil Hendrix on the Keydet career strikeout list. Acors has now totalled 245 in his career, passing Hendrix's 216.

Acors also took over the lead in career innings pitched at the Institute with 319.0 innings

under his belt in four years. Hendrix held that mark for VMI after totalling 306.2 innings in his career before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 2003 draft.

With his win over High Point in mid-May, Acors also moved into a tie for second on the career wins list at VMI with 13, as Ian Ostlund holds the record with 16.

Playing With the Big Boys

VMI didn't back off from any opponent last season, taking on the likes of SEC powers Vanderbilt and Auburn and the ACC's Florida State, Virginia & Virginia Tech. However, it's one thing to play against some of the best teams in the country, another thing to play with those teams.

And playing with those teams is exactly what the Keydets have done. VMI earned their first win over an opponent from either league this season with a 6-2 victory over Virginia Tech on April 27, marking the first time since 1987 the Keydets had defeated the Hokies. However, that wasn't the only game where VMI showed they had what it took against some of the country's best teams. They notched five one-run losses to teams from two of the best conferences in the country, holding an overall record of 1-9 against the ACC & SEC.

The nailbiters started opening weekend for the Keydets, as they fell 6-5 after going to the bottom of the ninth tied at five in their second game against #18 Florida State. Two weeks later, the Keys went to Nashville and played a pair of tough contests, falling 4-3 to #18 Vanderbilt after leading 3-0 in the second inning, then dropping a 5-2 decision the next day.

Both the first and third games at Auburn were decided by only a run, while the Keydets' trip to Charlottesville, Va. to play Virginia turned out to be more of the same, falling 2-1 after the Keydets saw two batters that they hit with a pitch come around to score the Cavaliers' only runs of the game.

No Assistance Needed

In the first two games against Longwood in early April, senior hurler Jimmy Thoms and junior pitcher J.J. Hollenbeck decided to finish what they started, as each starter went the distance, turning in complete games.

Thoms got things started on Friday, when he pitched the team's first complete game in almost a year, allowing four runs on 13 hits while striking out five in VMI's 11-4 victory. The next day, Hollenbeck did him one better, as he needed only 106 pitches to go the distance, striking out eight while walking none, allowing the Lancers one run (in the first inning) on seven hits.

The complete games were the Keydets' first of the season, while their last complete game came on April 24, 2004, when J.J. Hollenbeck hurled one in a 5-1 win over Winthrop.

Junior right-handed pitcher J.J. Hollenbeck was named Big South Conference Co-Pitcher of the Week after a stellar performance on March 26, when he allowed only one run on three hits

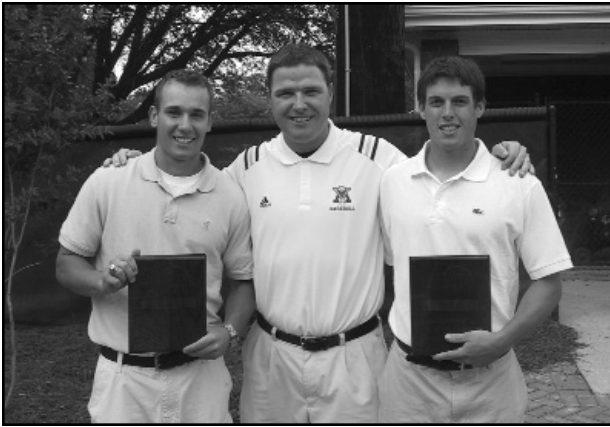

in a 3-2 VMI victory against #21 Coastal Carolina, the highest-ranked opponent the Keydets had defeated in over a decade.

Hollenbeck stymied the bats of the second-best hitting team in the Big South, allowing just one extra-base hit while the Chants posted only a .143 batting average. His effort ended Coastal's eight-game winning streak, and gave VMI their first win over a ranked team in over a year.

"J.J. has had great outings for us all year, it's good to see him get recognized like this," said VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry. "This was the second great outing he had against a ranked opponent this year, he pitched into the seventh inning at Vandy earlier this season too. I was proud of his work ethic and his preparation coming into last weekend, and it showed on Saturday."

Putting Up Goose Eggs

VMI's shutout of Navy in the opening game of their doubleheader in early March marked the Keydets' first shutout of the season. In the game, senior Duke Acors earned the win, allowing five hits in 6.1 innings of work, before handing the ball over to Josh Owens and Jeff DeMara to close out the game.

On March 18, the Keydets posted their second blanking of the season, a 23-0 win over UNC Asheville. Acors started that game as well, throwing seven shutout innings before Richard Litwin came on to close out the Bulldogs.

Earlier this season, Acors allowed the opposition to score in only one of his 19+ straight innings, that coming in his first inning at Auburn.

On May 21, VMI opened up their final weekend of the regular season with a 6-0 victory, a game that was played over two days after play was suspended Friday afternoon due to rain in the area, as the game was in the seventh inning with VMI ahead 6-0 when play was stopped.

The shutout over Navy was VMI's first in over a year, since they blanked the Mercer Bears on Feb. 8, 2004 in Macon, 6-0.

Streaking.....

Sophomore first baseman Robert Crumpler saw his team-high 15 game hitting streak come to an end against Coastal Carolina with an 0-4 day at the plate. His is only one of two streaks to break

double-digits this season, as Matt Smith hit in 10 consecutive games earlier this season. Smith also extended that streak to reaching base in 15 consecutive games, while Crumpler's 15-game hit streak currently ranks as the third-longest in the Big South this season.

"Stag" Party

Sophomore first baseman Robert Crumpler had a good time in early March when the Fairfield Stags came to town, going 4-for-5 and collecting seven RBI, the most for a Keydet this season. He also scored four times as the Keydets totaled a then-season-high 20 runs on 22 hits in the 20-2 win.

All in the Family

When Auburn and VMI squared off in mid-March, it marked the first time that brothers Andrew and Tom Slater have squared off in opposite dugouts in the collegiate ranks.

Andrew, a former assistant coach at VMI, played at Auburn when Tom, the current head coach for Auburn, was an assistant there in 1999 and 2000. Tom then returned to his alma mater to become the head coach at VMI in 2001 and engineered a remarkable turnaround that culminated in him being named 2003 Southern Conference Coach of the Year.

Andrew came to VMI in 2002 to work under his brother after serving as a student-assistant coach following his graduation from Auburn in 2001.

Another link between the two coaching staffs is found with current Auburn assistant coach Chris Finwood, who is a graduate and former head coach at VMI. Finwood was the head man in Lexington for three seasons after serving an assistant coach for three seasons as well. While coaching at VMI, Finwood recruited a catcher out of Douglas Freeman HS by the name of Marlin Ikenberry, the Keydets' current skipper.

The story continued in the offseason, when Finwood accepted the head coaching job at Western Kentucky and tapped Andrew Slater to be his top assistant at the Ohio Valley Conference institution.
