Noting The Keydets

Cardiac Keydets

In 2008, VMI had no issues with waiting until the last minute to claim victories.

The Keydets claimed eight wins in their final at bat last season. Even more impressively, six of those came in conference play, where the team claimed 14 wins in all.

The first such win came on the second week-end of the season, when VMI put up three runs in the bottom of the eighth to claim a 9-7 lead, then held on for a win over Binghamton in the second game of a doubleheader.

On the Big South's opening weekend, a three-run home run by Jordan Ballard brought VMI from behind on their way to a 5-3 win at High Point.

The biggest of all came against #15 Coastal Carolina, when Shane Geisslinger's chopper into left field plated Justin Hess to give the Keydets their first win of the year over a ranked opponent.

The Keydets were back at it against Virginia Tech just three days later, walking off with an 8-7 win, as Geisslinger drew a bases-loaded walk.

The Keydets also claimed three extra-inning wins in league play, with two coming against Radford and another against Liberty.

In the regular season finale against Charleston Southern, the Keydets rallied with three runs in the eighth to claim a 9-7 win, sweeping the series.

VMI lost only three games last year in its opponents' final at bat, falling 4-3 against Binghamton in the first game of the previously mentioned doubleheader and in extra innings at Virginia before suffering a heart-breaking, 3-1 loss in an elimination game at the Big South Championship to Coastal Carolina.

Keydets Get It Done In Conference

Thanks to three sweeps and a road series win, VMI posted its best-ever finish since joining the Big South Conference, tying with Liberty for second place in the league standings with a 14-7 mark.

The .667 conference winning percentage ties the school record from when the 1987 squad, led by current VMI Athletic Director Donny White, went 8-4.

The 14-7 conference record is also VMI's first winning conference season since joining the Big South and its first since the team went 16-14 under Tom Slater in 2003. The 14 wins are the second-most in school history behind the 2003 squad.

Hit Parade

The Keydet bats showed no signs of rust following an eight-day layoff for final exams, pounding out a school-record 23 hits in a 21-1 win over Maryland-Eastern Shore on Friday, May 9.

Freshman Sam Roberts led the charge, tying a school record for hits in a game, going 6-for-7 with five singles, a double, four runs scored and three RBIs. His six hits tied the record set by Bobby Ross in 1956 and matched by Warren Williams in 1992.

The game also saw sophomore Justin Hess set a career-high by going 5-for-5, finishing a home run short of a cycle.

In all, four different Keydets had at least three hits, including Jordan Ballard, who hit the game's only home run.

Keydets Top League Pitching Charts

A key to VMI's success in the 2008 season was the prowess of the team's pitching staff, which finished the season atop several categories in the Big South statistics.

The Keydets led the league in ERA (4.13) and walks per nine innings (2.54) while ranking second in strikeouts per nine innings (7.95).

Additionally, the Keydets led the Big South and ranked fourth nationally with only 2.54 walks per nine innings, while also leading the league with a 3.13 strikeout-to-walk ratio and 1.33 WHIP (Walks + Hits per Inning Pitched).

Bowman Named Pitcher of the Week

Junior right-hander Michael Bowman was named Big South Conference New Balance Pitcher of the Week for the week ending May 18.

Bowman (Richmond, Va./Deep Run) struck out

12 without walking a batter in two appearances during the week. On Tuesday against #28 Virginia, Bowman was tagged with the loss despite allowing only two unearned runs in 2.1 innings. He then responded by striking out 10 batters and scattering five hits and one run in six innings to defeat Charleston Southern in the series opener with the Buccaneers on Friday. Bowman's line on the week: 1-1, 1.08 ERA, 8.1 IP, 8 H, 3 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 12 SO, .222 opponents' batting average.

Bowman is VMI's career leader with a .245 opposing batting average, while ranking second in career ERA (3.32), third in career wins (14) and fourth in walks allowed per nine innings (2.80), strikeouts per nine innings (8.35) and strikeouts (209).

A Second Team All-Conference selection in 2007, the award was Bowman's first time being named Big South Pitcher of the Week. He was the second Keydet to earn Pitcher of the Week honors in 2008, joining Chris Henderson, who was so named on March 24.

Roberts Finds His Rhythm

Freshman Sam Roberts ended the year swinging a hot stick, surging to the team lead in several categories.

Roberts reached base safely in 37 of the team's final 41 games, and saw a remarkable six-game hitting streak end during the last week of the regular season. During the streak, Roberts had multiple hits in each contest, hitting 19-for-31 (.613) with nine RBIs, six runs scored, three doubles, a triple, a .636 on-base percentage and a .774 slugging percentage.

Also during the streak, Roberts had a four-hit night against Longwood, and a school-record tying six-hit outing against Maryland-Eastern Shore. In that contest, he matched Bobby Ross (1956) and Warren Williams (1992) while also scoring four runs and driving in three.

He ended the year by leading the team with a .348 batting average, 14 doubles, a .431 on-base percentage and 28 walks while ranking second with 12 stolen bases (14 attempts). He also ranks sixth (tied) in the Big South in stolen bases, seventh in both batting average and on-base percentage, and tenth (tied) in walks.

His work at the plate only tells part of the story, as he also led the team with seven outfield assists while playing right field, throwing out three runners at the plate.

Ballard Bashes

In his sophomore season, first baseman Jordan Ballard became the Keydets' top power threat, leading the team with 12 home runs, 22 extra-base hits and a .533 slugging percentage.

And when he found his power stroke, the home runs seemed to come in bunches. In mid-March, the slugger hit four out in four games, including two at James Madison on March 26.

Ballard finished the year in the top ten in VMI single-season home runs, and narrowly missed the top ten in total bases.

He also became a much more consistent hitter in 2008, leading the team with 20 multiple-hit games, hitting .302 after hitting only .167 in limited action as a freshman.

The Troy, Va. native finished sixth (tied) in the Big South with 12 home runs.

Bullpen Comes Up Big

While VMI's weekend rotation received many of the headlines in the preseason, the team's bullpen became a big story during the season.

In the final 32 games, the VMI bullpen went 9-2 with six saves in 72 total appearances, posting an ERA of 2.57 with opponents hitting only .215.

In conference play, the bullpen was even more impressive, going 6-0 with six saves and a 3.06 ERA in 41 total appearances. Conference opponents hit only .236 off of Keydet relievers, who struck out 60 batters and walked only 20 in 67.2 innings.

In-State Standings

In 2008, the Keydets experienced solid success once again against their in-state opponents. Last season, VMI posted a winning record against fellow teams from the Commonwealth for the second straight season and for the third time in four years. Here is how all of the in-state teams fared against each other in '08:

Sandridge On A Tear In Conference

Redshirt sophomore Brian Sandridge enjoyed a standout campaign within the Big South a season ago, as he ended the year listed in the top ten in several statistical categories in league play.

Sandridge ranked fourth in the Big South in Conference play with 34 hits and seventh (tied) with five home runs, 53 total bases and ninth with a .374 batting average.

He saw his career-best 14-game hitting streak snapped in game one against #15 Coastal, during which he was 28-for-68 (.412) with four doubles, two home runs, 14 RBIs and nine runs scored.

Geisslinger Muscles Up

Entering his senior season at VMI, second baseman Shane Geisslinger had six career extra-base hits, all doubles, in 112 career contests.

In 2008, Geisslinger had nine doubles and his first career triple, surpassing his previous career total of extra-base hits.

On opening weekend, Geisslinger collected doubles in each of the weekend's three contests. Additionally, Geisslinger established a new career-high with four RBI in the season-opener, besting his previous high of three from his freshman season against Richmond.

Geisslinger topped the Keydet ledger with his 44 runs scored, 18 stolen bases (in 22 attempts) and

ranked second with 18 multiple-hit games and 25 walks. He also ranked second in the Big South in stolen bases, fifth (tied) with 10 sacrifice hits, eighth (tied) with 11 hit by pitches and tenth in on-base percentage (.417).

Over the final 26 games of the year, Geisslinger hit .337 with a .477 OBP and 16 walks, having reached base safely in 24 of the 26 games.

VMI Scores Third Big South Sweep

The Keydets notched another first on the final weekend of the regular season by sweeping Charleston Southern.

It marked the first time VMI had ever swept three conference opponents in the same season. Before sweeping Charleston Southern, VMI had broken out the broom against High Point and Radford.

VMI pounded out 24 runs in the first two games of the series against CSU, winning 14-3 and 10-2, before having to rally to win the finale, 9-7.

On the series, the Keydets hit .327 with a .536 slugging percentage while holding a .441 on-base percentage.

VMI also scored 14 unearned runs in the series, thanks to 13 CSU errors.

Sixteen Innings In Sixteen Lines (Part One)

In what was believed to be the longest game in the modern era of both teams, VMI defeated Radford 3-2 in 16 innings on Monday, April 7.

VMI left a season-high 21 men on base in the game that was mercifully ended when Justin Topping, the 32nd player to play in the game, plated Brian Sandridge with a sacrifice fly.

Keydet reliever Travis Smink earned the win by no-hitting Radford for the final six innings, while the Keydets stranded 10 in extras alone.

Sandridge set a school record for at bats while going 4-for-8, and his three doubles tied a school mark in the 4-hour, 32-minute affair.

In the VMI annals, a 16-inning game was played in 1929, as VMI Hall of Famer Lefty Williams took a complete-game, 1-0 loss versus Virginia Tech.

Sixteen Innings In Sixteen Lines (Part Two)

VMI improved to 2-0 in 16-inning Big South games by outlasting Liberty, 6-5, on Saturday, April 19 at Worthington Stadium.

The Keydets knotted the game at four in the ninth, when Brian Sandridge scored Thane Smith.

Travis Smink blanked the Flames for seven-plus innings of relief, until the 15th inning.

The Keydets had taken a 5-4 lead on Mike Roberts' single, but LU rallied to tie the game and put the winning run at second base with one out.

Chris Duty came on to escape the jam, giving the Keydets new life. They took advantage, as A.J. Yoder drove home Sandridge to take a 6-5 lead. Duty retired the Flames in order to secure the win.

Mike Roberts plated four of the six Keydet runs, as VMI improved to 3-0 in extra innings.

Biagini Still Rolling Along

Sophomore Tanner Biagini's bat never cooled much from the torrid pace he set to open the 2008 season.

Biagini reached base safely in 37 of the final 39 games last season, posting hits in 44 of the team's 55 games. He ended the year with a team-high 74 hits, 46 RBIs and 114 total bases while ranking second with a .343 batting average, .528 slugging percentage, 10 home runs and 41 runs scored.

Additionally, Biagini ranked tenth in the Big South with 46 RBIs.

Early in the year, Biagini had a career-best 5-for-5 outing in game two against High Point, the most hits by a Keydet in a game since Mike Roberts went 5-for-6 against Radford on May 12, 2007.

He also hit his first career grand slam while driving in a career-best five in a 13-4 win over Coppin State.

Chris Does His Duty

Sophomore Chris Duty certainly lived up to his surname in early April, working in relief in six consecutive games over a nine-day span as the Keydets went 5-1.

Duty began the run by throwing an inning in the Sunday game against Winthrop (3/30). He picked up a win while throwing three innings against Richmond (4/1), worked an inning against Old Dominion (4/2), then then appeared in all three games against Radford, picking up the win in game one of the series (4/6).

As a whole, Duty worked 9.2 innings, allowing five hits and two unearned runs over the stretch.

Keydets Pick Up Second Big South Sweep

It took an extra day and nine extra innings, but VMI claimed their second Big South sweep of the year by taking care of Radford in a three-game set at Gray-Minor Stadium in early April.

After postponing the Friday game, the teams met in game one on Saturday, when nine innings weren't enough to wrap things up. Mother Nature intervened at the end of nine, and the game was finished on Sunday afternoon. VMI took a 4-3 win when Brian Sandridge hit his first career walk-off home run, a three-run shot in the bottom of the 11th after RU's Alex Gregory gave the Highlanders the lead with his two-run bomb in the top-half.

The regularly-scheduled Sunday game was a pedestrian 9-5 VMI win, before the teams played on Monday evening to make up Friday's postponement.

And play they would. Thirty-two players saw action in a 16-inning marathon, believed to be the longest game in the modern era for both programs. Justin Topping plated Brian Sandridge with the winning run on a sacrifice fly, ending the marathon after four hours and 32 minutes.

The home sweep of a conference opponent was VMI's first since sweeping High Point on May 13-15, 2005.

Sandridge Named Big South Player of the Week

Rockbridge County product Brian Sandridge had three multiple-hit games and hit a three-run, walk-off home run in the 11th inning to defeat Radford, 4-3. For his efforts, Sandridge was named Big South Conference Choice Hotels Player of the

Week for the period ending April 7.

Sandridge drove in runs in all four games, as VMI went 4-0 against four in-state opponents. He went 3-for-4 with two doubles and two runs scored against Richmond, and had a 3-for-4 game with three RBIs in Sunday's win against the Highlanders, driving home the tying run in the fifth inning. He also went 2-for-5 with the walk-off home run in game one of the series against Radford, the first walk-off win for VMI this season.

On the week, the redshirt-sophomore outfielder was 8-for-17 (.471) with three runs scored, eight RBI, two doubles, one home run and two walks, in addition to a .765 slugging percentage and .526 on-base percentage. It marked the first time in his career that Sandridge had earned Big South Player of the Week accolades.

Henderson Named Big South Pitcher of the Week

Junior right-hander Chris Henderson was named Big South Conference New Balance Pitcher of the Week for the week ending March 23.

Henderson (Fredericksburg, Va./Colonial Forge) struck out a career-best 10, including nine in the first four innings, while pitching seven innings of VMI's first shutout of the 2008 season. Henderson walked only one batter while scattering five hits, earning his third win of the season. He also worked a scoreless inning of relief in an 11-2 mid-week win against Norfolk State, as the Keydets went 4-0 on the road over Spring Break.

That marked the second time that Henderson has been named Big South Pitcher of the Week. He also earned the honor in April 2007, when he set down 15 batters in a row while pitching 7.2 innings against #3 Virginia in a 5-3 win. He followed that up four days later, when he faced the minimum through six innings against High Point before leaving in the seventh with a 3-2 lead.

Pitching Dominates In Conference-Opening Sweep

Against an offense regarded as one of the top in the Big South, the VMI pitching staff dominated its conference-opening series against High Point, leading the Keydets to a sweep.

VMI got phenomenal starting pitching from Trey Barham, Michael Bowman and Chris Henderson, with each of the three collecting quality starts, consisting of six or more innings pitched and less than three earned runs allowed. Barham threw an opening day complete game, allowing one earned run, before Bowman allowed only three earned runs through seven innings. Henderson followed with perhaps the best performance of his career, striking out a career-best 10 while throwing seven innings of VMI's first shutout of the season.

On the weekend, the Keydet starting pitchers combined to go 2-0 with a 1.57 ERA, pitching 23 of the weekend's 27 innings. They struck out 22 batters while walking only three as the Panthers hit .205 against them.

In relief, the staff was equally up to the challenge, as Jason Farley collected a win and a save on Saturday while Travis Smink earned his first Big South save. In three appearances, Smink and Farley allowed two hits in four innings, striking out four while walk-

ing one as the Panthers hit .143 and failed to score against the duo.

VMI Wins Conference Opening Series For Fourth Straight Year

In an impressive run, VMI has now opened up each of the past four conference seasons with a series win.

In 2005, the Keydets took two of three against UNC Asheville at home, before taking two of three at home against Charleston Southern in 2006. Last season, VMI swept CSU on the road before opening up this conference season with another road sweep, this time of High Point.

Barham Has CLASS

Left-handed pitcher Trey Barham was listed as one of thirty candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to NCAA Division I student-athletes in eight sports, the award focuses on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award was launched in 2001 to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who fulfill their entire athletic eligibility and pursue their degree. Since that time, Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA®, has expanded the award to include other NCAA sports including baseball.

Barham is VMI's career leader in both wins and strikeouts, while ranking second in starts, innings and opponent batting average. VMI was 31-17 in his 48 career starts.

Barham was one of two candidates listed from the Big South Conference, joining Coastal Carolina's Tommy Baldrige, while he was the only player listed from the state of Virginia.

Roberts Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List

Junior catcher Mike Roberts was named to the watch list for the 2008 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Award delivered by AT&T and Papa John's Pizza, given annually to the top catcher in the NCAA's Division I.

Roberts (Prince George, Va./Prince George) finished the year ranked second on the team with 44 RBIs and third on the squad with nine home runs and a .480 slugging percentage.

Roberts became the first Keydet to be included on the Johnny Bench Award Watch List in the recognition's nine-year history.

Season Opener at Home a Rarity

When VMI hosted Lafayette to start the 2008 campaign, it was no small feat. In fact, it was the first time in 27 years that VMI opened a season on post.

In 1981, the Keydets hosted Davis & Elkins to begin the season and dropped that season-opener. Since that time, VMI did play Mary Washington at Washington & Lee to begin the 1988 season, but have not hosted a season opener on post.

The last time the Keydets won a season opener on post before 2008's 7-1 victory over the Leopards came on March 20, 1971, when the Keydets knocked off St. Francis (N.Y.) 7-5.

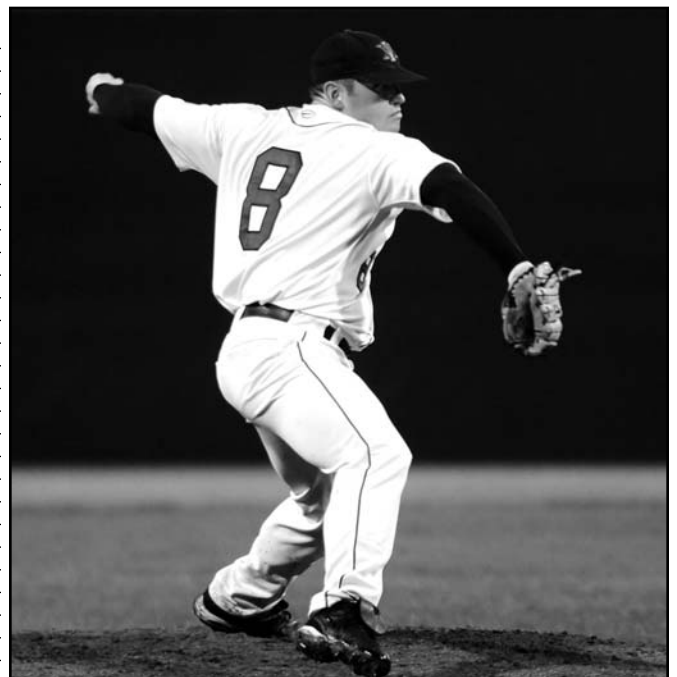

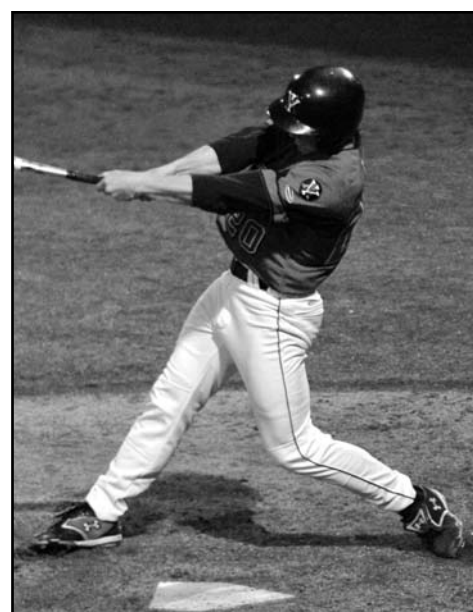
