Sweppenhiser: All-Time Hit King

With a hot shot to third base in the first inning at James Madison, VMI senior third baseman Kelly Sweppenhiser became the all-time leader in career hits by collecting his 259th all-time knock, passing Chris Catanzaro's record he established from the 1998-2001 seasons. He wrapped up his stellar career with 263 hits, while also claiming a number of other school records along the way:

- * With his third-inning single in the team's final contest versus #16 Winthrop, Sweppenhiser took over sole possession of the career total bases mark with the 411th of his career.
- * In that same at bat, he tied Matt Smith with his 753rd at bat. He ended the game with 756, a new school record.
- * After getting on base with that third-inning single, he came around to score on a single from Jacoby Fields. By scoring that run, Sweppenhiser broke Chris Catanzaro's mark of 171, while he ended the game with 172.
- * His solo home run in the eighth inning of the Keydets' 10-4 victory in game two against #16 Winthrop tied him for second on the career RBI list with 149, as Scott Thompkins also had 149 in his career, just six shy of the all-time record.
- * With that roundtripper, Sweppenhiser moved into a three-way tie for fourth place with 31 home runs to his credit.
- * With his third-inning double in game two against UNC Asheville, Sweppenhiser moved into third place with 49 career doubles.
- * As far as percentages go, Sweppenhiser leaves the Institute as the career leader with a .457 on-base percentage, while ranking fourth with a .348 batting average and seventh with a .544 slugging percentage.

Caution: School Records Falling!

When J.J. Hollenbeck recorded the final out of his first career complete game against North Carolina A&T on May 13, he and the rest of the 2006 senior class saw the school record for wins fall for the third time in their four years in Lexington. The Keydets didn't stop there though, collecting two more wins over #16 Winthrop to complete the first 30-win season in the program's history, while also capturing their first winning season in 41 years. Other school records to fall this season:

Team Marks

- * The 2006 Keydets scored 376 runs on the season, blowing away the previous record of 352, set in 2000.
- * With an impressive showing the final two weekends against two of the top hitting teams in the country, the team posted their best ERA

in 32 seasons, ending the season with a 4.80 mark. Remarkably, the staff did so while also posting the highest innings total in the school's history (482.0).

- * By being hit with 119 pitches, the Keydets not only shattered the school record total of 71 set in 2005, but posted the fourth-highest total in Division I history. Their average of 2.16 per game is the highest in Division I history.
- * With 549 hits, the Keydets surpassed the 2005 total of 541.
- * By collecting 324 RBI, the '06 team surpassed the 1999 mark of 315.
- * When Trey Barham came on to pitch the final 3.1 innings of the team's 30th win over #16 Winthrop, he not only picked up the first save of his career, but helped the team tie the single-season high of 12, set in 1993.

Individual Marks

- * By being hit with 23 pitches, senior B.T. Good blew away his own school-record total of 17 that he established in 2005. Senior Kelly Sweppenhiser and junior Robert Crumpler were also hit with 18 pitches, tying them for the second-most all-time.
- * Sweppenhiser established a new record with 58 runs scored, bettering the old mark of 56 that was also tied by junior Chad Rice.
- * Rice's 186 assists this season passed the 2004 mark of Matt Smith, who totaled 163 in his junior season at shortstop.
- * Sweppenhiser collected the third-most hits in a single-season by finishing up with 72, just four behind the school-record total of Chris Catanzaro in 2000. Sophomore Clint Reed tied for the fourth-most in a single-season with his total of 70.
- * With his 21 doubles, Reed also put together the second-most two-baggers in a season, just three behind Catanzaro's 2000 total.
- * Sophomore Trey Barham and freshman Travis Smink each collected seven wins, tying them for the second-most in a season all-time.
- * Barham also notched the second-most innings (94.1) and strikeouts (98) for a VMI hurler in a single season, while tying the second-most starts (16) made in a campaign.
- * By making only four errors while starting 50 games at first base, Crumpler completed the fourth-best fielding season in VMI history, putting up a .992 fielding percentage.

Sweppenhiser A Player To Watch

Keydet fans knew for four years that third baseman Kelly Sweppenhiser was a player to watch whenever he stepped on the diamond. Last season, the rest of the country came to agree. Sweppenhiser was named to the Dick

Howser Watch List in late April, becoming the first Keydet to earn such an honor. He is one of 64 players throughout the country eligible for the award, given annually to collegiate baseball's top player. Sweppenhiser is the only player listed from the Big South, and one of seven players listed from Virginia.

Sweppenhiser added yet another accomplishment in early May, when it was announced he made ESPN The Magazine's First Team Academic All-District III. He was one of 13 Division I players in Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Florida to be named to the team. He is the only Big South player to do so, and is one of two Virginians on the team.

"Way to Wear It"

That's what you heard from the VMI dugout each time a Keydet was hit by a pitch last season. And in 2006, that was quite a lot. The Keydets led the country by being hit by 119 pitches in 55 games.

In the second game against Liberty, VMI was hit by four consecutive pitches in the ninth inning, five overall in the frame and nine in the game. Being hit by five pitches in an inning ties the second-most in NCAA history, as does the nine in one contest. Each total fell one short of their respective records.

Junior first baseman Robert Crumpler was hit four consecutive plate appearances over a two-game span against Liberty, with one of those coming in the aforementioned ninth inning. It is currently unknown where this feat ranks in the NCAA annals.

What is known, however, is that the 1997 Nevada baseball team holds the single-season record in this category, being hit 125 times in 60 contests. They are the only team to average being hit by more than two pitches per game, averaging 2.08 that season. The Keydets blew that mark away, by averaging a 2.16 clip through 55 games.

Keydets Go The Distance

In 2006, the Keydets posted six complete games, with those coming from three different pitchers, the team's weekend starters down the stretch. However, five of those six came in the season's final three weeks, with varying results.

Sophomore Trey Barham hurled the team's first nine-inning effort on March 17 against Charleston Southern, the team's first Big South contest of the season. Making his first career League start, Barham allowed only two hits and an unearned run in the team's 16-1 victory.

Barham then hurled the team's next CG on

May 6 in the series-opener against Coastal Carolina. Against the Chanticleers, the south-paw two unearned runs on three hits while striking out nine batters in the team's 8-2 victory.

Two days later against Coastal, freshman Travis Smink picked up his first career complete game, surrendering only two runs, one earned, on four hits. However, he was outdueling by CCU freshman Bobby Gagg, who threw a shutout to defeat the Keydets 2-0 in the series' rubber game.

Just five days later, on May 13, senior J.J. Hollenbeck dominated in his finest outing of the season, picking up nine K's while giving up only five hits in his first career complete-game shutout. The 5-0 win in the second game of a doubleheader against N.C. A&T not only provided the series win for VMI, but also gave the team their 28th win of the season, breaking the school record for wins while assuring the team of their first winning record in 41 years.

Four days after Hollenbeck's gem, Barham stepped out for a start against the heavy-hitting JMU Dukes. The boys from Harrisonburg rank among the nation's top hitting teams, but couldn't do much with Barham. Barham kept the Dukes at bay for eight innings, surrendering only an eighth-inning tally to make the score 1-0. But after VMI tied the contest in the ninth, Nate Schill led off the bottom of the ninth with a walk-off home run, spoiling Barham's career-best 12 strikeout performance.

Three days later, Hollenbeck posted his second career CG victory over Winthrop, defeating the 16th-ranked Eagles by allowing four runs on eight hits while striking out four. By earning the 10-4 win, Hollenbeck posted his second victory over the Eagles, the Keydets' only two wins against WU until the next day, when Michael Bowman picked up the W to clinch the team's 30th win of the season.

Geisslinger Burns Up the Basepaths

In the second meeting of the season between VMI and Richmond, sophomore second baseman established a new VMI record, stealing five bases in five attempts in the Keydets' 16-9 victory.

Geisslinger accounted for five of the team's eight stolen bases in eight attempts. He stole second base in the fourth inning following a single on a check-swing, then stole second and third base in the fifth inning following his walk. He then proceeded to swipe second base again in the sixth and steal third base in the eighth inning to complete his record-setting day.

The five stolen bases matches a Big South

Conference record, established in 1990 by Coastal Carolina's Mark Romer, when swiped five against North Carolina. The all-time NCAA record is eight, which has been accomplished twice.

Six: The Keydets' Magic Number

For the Keydets in 2006, six runs was the magic number.

When VMI scored at least six runs, the team was 25-7, compared to just a 5-18 record when they failed to do so.

On the other side, the team was 25-10 when allowing six runs or less, while holding a 5-15 mark when allowing more than six.

Also, in a nod to the work the Keydets did out of the bullpen, the team was 25-2 when leading through six innings, as well as 26-1 when leading through eight innings.

Thievery A "Good" Thing

With his steal of second base in the third inning of the final game against North Carolina A&T, B.T. Good tied current VMI Athletic Director Donny White for third fourth in career stolen bases at VMI. White, who played from 1963-65, stole 56 bases in his three year career, while Good swiped 56 bags in four seasons in Lexington.

Young Guns On Target

Coming into the 2006 season, there was no doubt that much of the team's success would be dependent on the team's freshman class of pitchers. At the end of the season, it's safe to say that the results were a success.

Seven true freshmen saw mound time for the Keydets, combining for an impressive 18-10 record with five saves. On the season, the "Young Guns" combined to throw 246 of the team's 482 innings.

During the team's nine-game win streak early in the season, seven of the nine wins came from the freshman class, with three each belonging to Michael Bowman and Travis Smink, while the other went to Kevin Crum. The other four members of the class that saw time on the mound include Chris Henderson, John Phelps, Kevin Booth and Matt Edwards.

Keydets Sweep Weekly Honors

Following the Keydets' Big South opening series win over Charleston Southern, first baseman Robert Crumpler and pitcher Trey Barham became the first pair in VMI history to sweep a Conference's Player and Pitcher of the Week awards.

Crumpler won the award after hitting .533

on the week, scoring seven runs and five RBI in leading the Keydets to a 3-1 mark on the week. Barham took the honors following his complete-game, two-hitter against CSU.

Crumpler, who earned the honor once last season, joins teammates Klint Reed (Feb. 14) and Kelly Sweppenhiser (Feb. 21), who each were named Big South Player of the Week earlier in the season. Barham became VMI's first Pitcher of the Week honoree since J.J. Hollenbeck earned the honor in March of 2005.

Smink Completes Trifecta

In a three-game series against Lafayette, freshman hurler Travis Smink not only finished all three of VMI's one-run victories, he earned a win and two saves for his work, all within 24 hours.

In game one, Smink entered the contest with two outs in the top of the ninth with the tying run 90 feet away and proceeded to strike out Lafayette's Kevin Reese to wrap up his first career save.

In the second game of the scheduled doubleheader, Smink came into the game with runners on the corners and no outs recorded in the eighth inning. After allowing a sacrifice fly to the first batter he faced, he got out of the inning thanks to a caught stealing and a flyout to centerfield. Following the bottom of the eighth, the game was suspended due to darkness, and was resumed on Sunday afternoon. Smink stayed in the game to work the ninth, and induced a groundout before striking out the final two batters to pick up his second save in as many games.

Smink then notched what was then his longest outing of the season in game three, working the final three innings to earn the win. He allowed his only hit of the weekend to the first batter he faced when he was brought in to a bases loaded, no out jam in the seventh. He then induced a pair of fielder's choices before a fielding error extended the inning. However, Smink was unfazed in striking out the next batter to end the Leopard rally.

Trailing by one run, the Keydets responded as a two-run double by B.T. Good put Smink in line for the win. He then went out and retired six of the final seven batters he faced, walking only the cleanup man, as he wrapped up his third win of the season, all in relief. On the weekend, Smink worked 5.1 innings in three appearances, allowing no runs, one hit and two walks while striking out five. Opponents hit .063 on the weekend against him, as he faced 19 batters, recording 17 outs.

For his effort, Smink earned national atten-

tion, as he was honored on the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll, joining fellow Herndon, Pa. native Kelly Sweppenhiser and sophomore hurler Trey Barham as the only Keydets to be so honored last season.

Home Sweet Home

Though Patchin Field was undergoing renovations in preparation for the opening of Gray-Minor Stadium throughout most of the season, there was nowhere else the Keydets would have rather played, as they set a school record for consecutive home wins with 12 in early 2006.

The streak began in 2005, as the Keydets were able to salvage the final game of a week-end series versus Liberty on May 1, 2005. They then swept High Point on the final week-end before closing out the year with a 16-7 mid-week win over Georgetown.

In '06, the Keydets opened up by sweeping a two-game series against Coppin State on Feb. 17-19, while they set the record by sweeping a three-game set from Lafayette. They then took the first two games against Albany, before the streak ended on March 5 in a 14-13 loss.

The team surpassed the previous best of nine straight home wins that had been achieved twice, most recently in 2005 between Feb. 26-Mar. 7.

With their 24-8 mark at Patchin Field, the 2006 team surpassed the most wins ever in a season at Patchin Field, as they went 19-8 at home in 2005.

Sweppenhiser Hits for Ice-Cycle

With temperatures never climbing above freezing, senior Kelly Sweppenhiser's bat could not have been hotter on Sunday, Feb. 19, as he hit for VMI's first cycle in approximately 20 years.

Sweppenhiser got going early with a first-inning, three-run homer to give the Keydets' a 3-2 advantage early. He kept it going with a third-inning double down the left field line and a fifth-inning triple off of the right-center field wall. He drew a walk in the sixth inning before coming to the plate with the bases empty and two outs in the eighth inning. With the count at 2-2, Sweppenhiser hit a perfectly-placed grounder to the left-side of the infield that neither the third baseman or shortstop could make a play on, completing the cycle.

It has been confirmed that it is the first cycle in the Big South Conference since UNCA's Grant Rembert did so in the first

round of the 2002 Big South Championship. It is believed to be the first cycle by a Keydet in at least 20 years.

Sweppenhiser received national acclaim for his week, as he earned a spot on the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll, a list highlighting the top performances from around the country each week. He was also honored by the Big South Conference, earning Player of the Week honors. It marked the second consecutive week a Keydet received the honor, after Klint Reed earned Co-Player of the Week honors the week previous.

Starting Out With A Bang

The Keydets wasted no time making major headlines this season, taking two of three from the 2005 Tallahassee Regional Finalist Auburn Tigers on opening weekend.

The game-two win over the Tigers marked the Keydets' first over a current member of the SEC since April 5, 1922, when the Keydets no-hit South Carolina in the first baseball game ever played at Alumni Field, the Institute's football stadium. Frank M. Page, Jr. hurled the no-no, as he went 8-2 in leading the Keydets to the first of two consecutive state championships in 1922. Also in that contest vs. South Carolina, Joseph M. Hatchett hit a home run to centerfield on the first pitch ever thrown to a VMI batter at Alumni Field, followed later that inning by another centerfield home run by Edward Ryder.

The series win by the Keydets marked the first ever for the program over an opponent from the SEC. It also was the first series win by a Big South team over an SEC program since Feb. 20-21, 2001, when Winthrop took both games of a weekend series at Florida by 11-7 and 14-5 margins.

How Sweet It Is

When the Keydets took two of three from Auburn on opening weekend, the series win made headlines for the program, as it was their first time ever defeating an SEC opponent in a series.

However, for VMI skipper Marlin Ikenberry, the win was especially sweet, as it came against his mentor, former VMI player and head coach Tom Slater. Slater took over the Auburn program prior to the 2005 season, and guided the Tigers to the finals of the Tallahassee Regional before falling to Florida State.

Slater, VMI class of 1990, hired Ikenberry, VMI class of 1995, in 2000 as an assistant coach. Ikenberry was on Slater's staff for each of his three seasons as the Keydets' head coach, and assumed the helm when Slater took

an assistant coaching job at the University of Florida in 2003.

More remarkable over the weekend was that Ikenberry passed Slater on the Keydets' career wins list. Entering the weekend, each coach had guided VMI to 50 wins before Ikenberry took two of three to break the tie.
