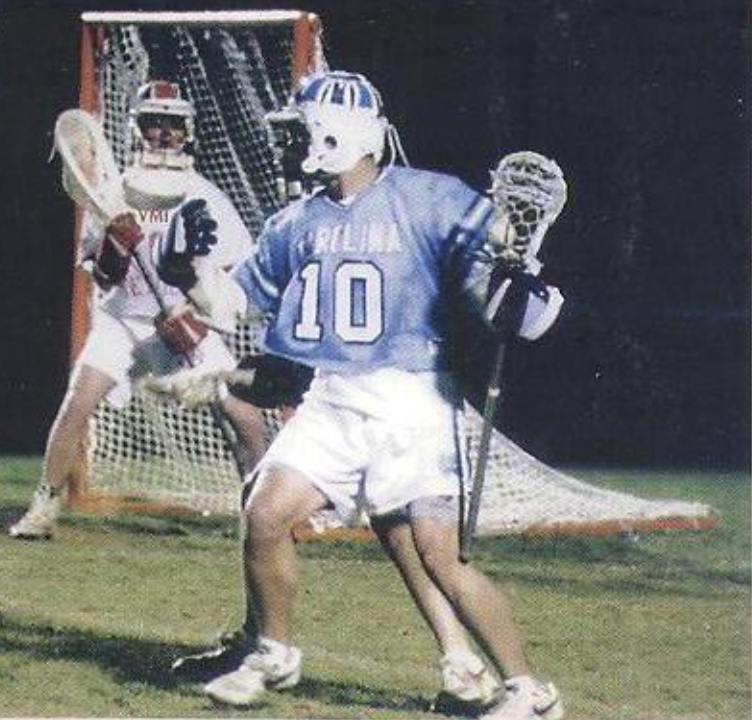

FACILITIES

The Keydets are fortunate to have two fields which they can call home, each offering a quality surface for VMI lacrosse.

Major games on the schedule are played at Alumni Memorial Field, which has a seating capacity of 10,000, and also serves as the home of the VMI football and track and field programs. With ample seating for fans as well as full press box facilities and a lounge for guests, Alumni Memorial Field has seen some of the best teams in the nation play on its field. In the past the facility has hosted Virginia and is the site every other year for the annual Lee-Jackson clash with neighbor Washington & Lee.

The majority of VMI's home games are played within the cozy confines of Patchin Field, which is alongside the soccer, baseball, and tennis facilities at VMI. Patchin Field, which is built over the top of Woods' Creek, offers separate game and practice fields for VMI lacrosse, and has separate locker room facilities, a training room, and storage space. Plans are in the works to expand the facilities at Patchin Field, further enhancing the facilities VMI is able to offer to the student-athlete.

In 1994 a central irrigation system was installed at Patchin Field, improving the quality of the natural grass playing surfaces.

The field is named after Herb Patchin who was head athletic trainer and director of physical education at VMI for 34 years before his death in 1963. Long-time "clean" of Southern Conference trainers, Herb Patchin was one of 26 original selections to the Helms Hall of Fame for Athletic Trainers, and his name is inscribed in the International Sports Shrine in Los Angeles, California.

In addition to Patchin Field, VMI prides itself on being able to offer its lacrosse student-athletes excellent athletic facilities to develop their maximum potential.

The most extensive capital improvement of VMI athletic facilities, totalling close to \$3 million, took place over the past several years. In 1985, a 7,000 square foot weight room opened in Cocke Hall followed by complete renovation of the outdoor track a year later. Refurbishing of the Patchin Field complex with new locker room facilities for baseball, lacrosse, soccer and tennis was completed five years ago, and construction of a new football field house with press box and Superintendent's level renovation was opened for the 1988 season. The indoor track facility was recovered with a new polyurethane surface recently, and a massive refurbishing of the weight room was initiated, leading to the purchase of new weight training equipment.

DOUG BARTLETT

HEAD COACH

SUNY-Geneseo '70

12th Season at VMI / 13th Overall

79-68 at VMI / 89-71 Overall

As Doug Bartlett enters his twelfth season at the helm of the VMI lacrosse program, he will give to the 1997 squad what he has given to every other team he has headed at VMI — stability and success.

In 1986, Bartlett took over a team that began varsity play in 1983 and immediately brought respectability to the program. Only four times in his 12 years at VMI have the Keydets registered more losses than wins, and his 79-68 mark at VMI is a tribute to the job he has done building the Keydet program.

In the past eleven seasons Bartlett's accomplishments with the Keydet lacrosse program are unprecedented. His 1992 team was ranked in the Top 25 lacrosse poll, making it only the fourth team in VMI history to be ranked in a national poll, and his 1995 edition received votes as well. He has compiled a .537 winning percentage since coming to VMI, which is the second highest winning percentage of any coach currently at VMI, and the program's overall winning percentage is the third best among VMI's 13 intercollegiate sports.

Making his accomplishments all the more impressive is the level of competition that Bartlett and his team routinely face. The VMI lacrosse schedule is littered with the likes of Rutgers, Virginia, Lehigh, Maryland-Baltimore County and North Carolina — teams that make waves on the national lacrosse scene.

Heading into his 13th season as a head coach, Bartlett owns an

overall record of 89-71. His winning percentage of .556 is 24th best in the nation among active Division I coaches.

Bartlett's coaching excellence and accomplishments at VMI were recognized by his peers in 1992 when he was

selected as a coach for the South team in the 50th Annual North / South Lacrosse Classic. He currently serves as chairman of the Division I North / South Lacrosse game.

Bartlett has developed a reputation as a coach who pushes his players to excel on the field and pushes himself in the recruiting wars to obtain top notch lacrosse players for his program and for VMI.

Bartlett is a 1970 graduate of SUNY-Geneseo, where he started on the lacrosse team for four years. He previously coached at Radford University, first as an assistant and then as head coach. Doug and his wife Sarah are the parents of three daughters, Jessie (8), Kelsey (5), and Maiah (2).

BRIAN GRADY

ASSISTANT COACH

ST. LAWRENCE '89

As Brian Grady begins his third season as an assistant at VMI, opposing coaches have been forced to notice the job he has done with VMI's attackmen and goalies.

As for evidence of Grady's prowess as an offensive mind, one needs to look no further than the final 1996 NCAA lacrosse statistics. Among the nation's leaders in goals, assists and points was departed senior Joe Brockman, who flourished under Grady's tutelage. Brockman's 12-point explosion against Pfeiffer last year was the highest single-game total in the NCAA last year.

The play of Rob Worrell, who is entering his final season with the Keydets in 1996, is a testament to Grady's work as well. Worrell was ranked 11th in the nation in assists last year already owns the Institute's career assists record. Players under Grady's tutelage have cracked the top 3 in every career offensive category at VMI, and Worrell sits atop both single-season and career assist charts. In addition to individual success, VMI was the best team in the country when they were a man-up in 1996.

Former goalie Ryan Olson '96 also excelled the past three seasons. Olson's 272 saves last season was the second highest total ever at VMI, and Olson has more career saves than anybody who has ever worn the red, white and yellow.

In addition to his duties on the field, Grady is also an instructor in the Physical Education Department, and is the athletic department's assistant strength and conditioning coach.

Grady received his B.S. in sport and leisure studies in 1989 from St. Lawrence University, where he was a two-year letterwinner in lacrosse as an attackman. He completed his graduate work at the University of Virginia, where he received his Master's in exercise physiology in 1994.

He began his coaching career at Bay Shore Middle School (1989-90), before being named head lacrosse coach at The Shipley School, where he served two seasons and posted a 12-15 record. While pursuing his M.Ed. at Virginia, he was a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Cavaliers' athletic program. Following graduation from Virginia, he was head varsity coach at Fork Union Military Academy for the 1994 season, posting a 5-5 record.

A native of West Islip, New York, Grady resides in Lexington with his wife Jean.



DALLAS WOOD

ASST. ATHLETIC TRAINER/ASSISTANT COACH

GETTYSBURG COLLEGE '93

Dallas Wood begins his first year on the VMI athletic staff as an athletic trainer and an assistant coach.

Wood earned his bachelor of arts degree in health and physical education at Gettysburg College in 1993. Upon graduation, Wood worked at the Physical Therapy and Sports Medicine Clinic in Glastonbury, Conn. While there Wood worked with the Connecticut Coyotes of the Arena Football League and ran the clinic's community education program. Currently, Wood is working towards his Masters degree in sports medicine at the University of Virginia. He is scheduled to graduate in June of '97.

After being named an all-state defender at Glastonbury (Conn.) High School, Wood took his on-field skills to Gettysburg, a perennial Division III power, and was a three-year letterman as a defenseman. Wood will be responsible for coaching the VMI defensemen this spring.

He is married to Shanna Wood, and the couple resides in Lexington.

When VMI lacrosse coach Doug Bartlett looks at his 1997 lacrosse team he sees two things — youth and a bright future. Bartlett's biggest concern entering the season is how the squad's bright future will parlay into results this season.

With 18 freshmen and sophomores and only three returning starters on a 27-man roster, the Keydets will be among the youngest squads in the country. A difficult early season schedule will not allow the newcomers to become acclimated to the collegiate game slowly. With Rutgers, Air Force and Lehigh, all of whom received top 25 votes or were ranked last season, it won't take Bartlett and his team long to see where they stand.

The man called upon to carry the load for the Keydets will be Rob Worrell, the Institute's all-time leader in assists. Worrell, who led the team in assists last year (30) and was second in goals scored (30), will be counted on to do even more for the Keydets with the departure Joe Brockman.

While Worrell's scoring ability is unquestioned, he will need help if the Keydets are to be

successful, and help could come in the form of sophomore Mason Ayers. Ayers, who registered six goals and three assists as a midfielder last season, will slide into one of the attack positions. Sophomore Aaron Bush and freshman Matt Gallienne will battle for time up front as well.

Anchoring the midfield will be senior Chris Feltmann, who had eight goals and nine assists last season. After being used primarily as a reserve last season, Feltmann will assume full-time responsibilities this year. Andrew Rogers will be a vital cog in the Keydet attack as well. After scoring five goals and dishing out five assists last season, Rogers' increased offensive production could hold the key to VMI's fortunes this season.

Juniors Doug Locke, Jim Peay and Steve Schwanke, all of whom have shown steady improvement since their arrival at VMI, will be called upon to fortify the midfield. Freshman Mike Meyer will be in the mix for playing time as well. Locke had an outstanding fall and could help the Keydets answer some of their faceoff woes. Peay and Schwanke are both athletic players who can put the ball in the back of the net. Battling for time at long stick midfielder will be senior John Moder and sophomore Tim Remzi.

Leading the VMI defense, which must improve upon last season's goals-against average of 15.5, will be Josh Chance. Chance started five games as a freshman and should improve with a year of experience and a summer in the weightroom. Dave Benedick, who has a tremendous feel for the game, should be a leader for the Keydet defense, while Gary Goldsmith and Matt Williams, both of whom are 6-5, bring size and excellent stick skills to the defensive side of the field.

Tending goal for VMI will be senior Charles Ayers, who is replacing four-year starter Ryan Olson. While this will be Ayers' first season as a starter, he has improved in each of his four years and gained valuable experience playing behind Olson.

The feeling in the Keydet camp is that the transition in goal will be smooth, but how well the influx of new starters fair elsewhere will determine VMI's fate this season. Despite all of the new faces, VMI will have to tighten its defense, improve its percentage of faceoffs won and attempt to maintain last season's level of offensive production (11.8 goals a game). One area of excellence last season was VMI's play when it was a man-up. The team led the nation by scoring 45 percent of the time it held the man-up advantage.

A 6-8 campaign last year combined with the loss of eight starters guarantees that this will be one of Bartlett's biggest challenges since he took over the reigns at VMI 12 years ago, but as the 24th winningest coach in the nation's record suggests, it would be foolish to count the Keydets out.

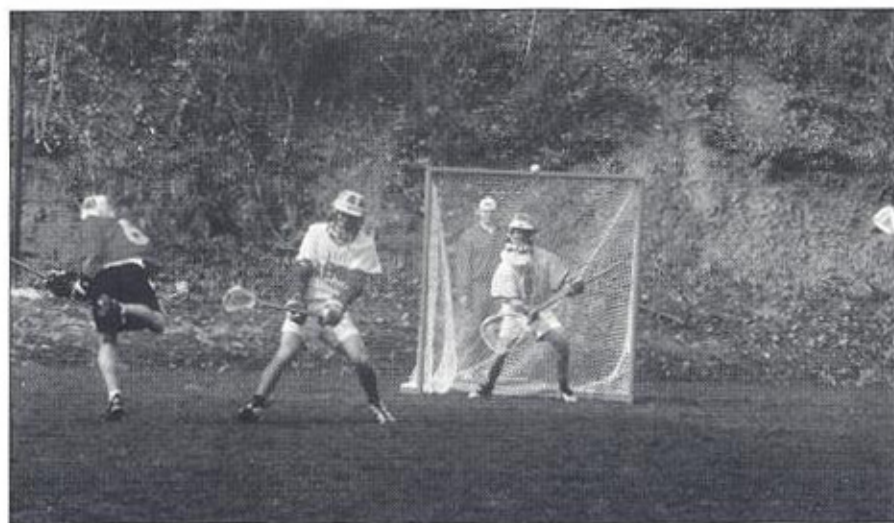


8 Charles Ayers

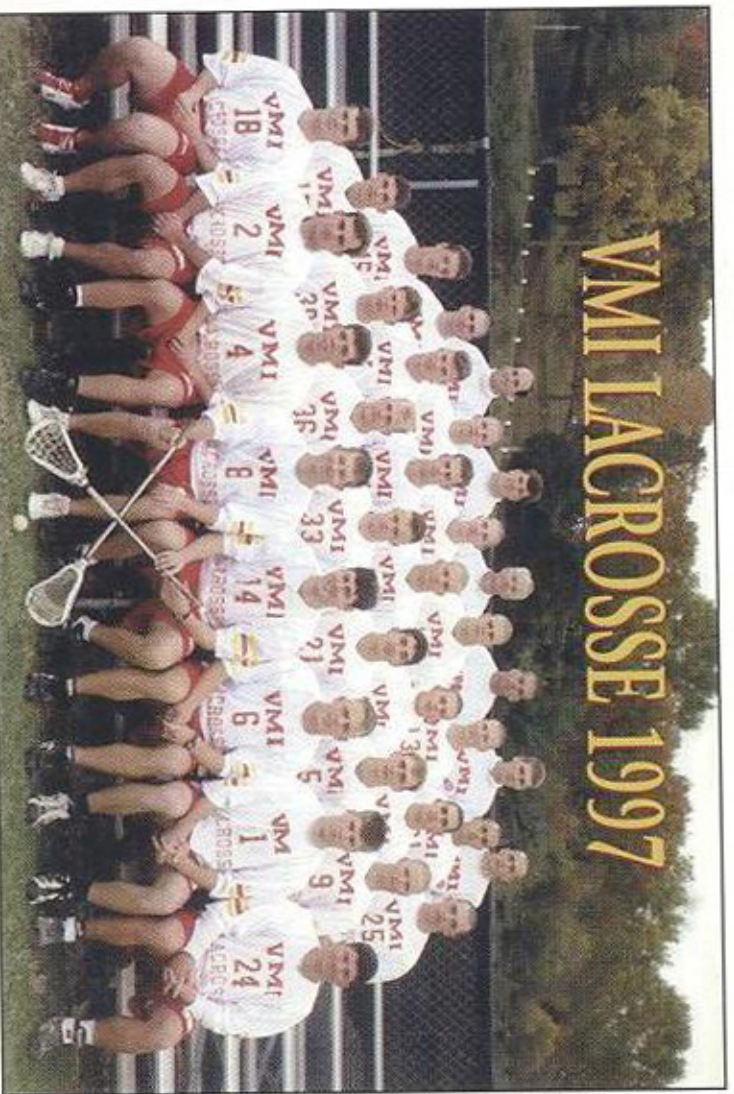
