VMI opened its 1988 baseball season with a 9-2 win over Mary Washington College Sunday in a game played at Washington & Lee. Keydet first year head coach Paul Maini worked three pitchers three innings each, and they responded by allowing just one earned run. Junior Todd Tilley opened the game giving up one run in his three inning stint, but it was unearned. Sophomore Mike Doczi pitched three shutout innings, while junior Richard Sparks allowed one earned run in the final three frames.

On the offensive side sophomore Tom Slater and junior Brian Swiencinski had the big bats. Slater, playing third base, went 4 for 5 and had three runs batted in, and Swiencinski, getting his first start ever, had a home run and a double, knocking in three runs as the Keydets' designated hitter.

"It was a nice way to open the season," said Maini. "We had three excellent performances from our pitching staff, and defensively we were sound in particular Gary Sibayan and Criss Finwood in the infield."

VMI has one more game this week at Duke on Thursday before heading south for a spring break road trip at Winter Park, Florida which includes games next week with Rollins College, Wake Forest, and the University of Maine.

Keydet Baseball Team Takes Three in Florida

The VMI baseball team wanted more wins on its recent roadtrip to Florida but the squad was able to make considerable progress nevertheless.

Playing in a very competitive environment for early season baseball, the Keydets participated in the Rollins Baseball Week Invitational Tournament and tackled Division I foes Maine and Wake Forest as well as Division II host Rollins. With all teams facing each other twice the Keydets came away with two victories over Rollins 5-4, 5-1 and thumped Villanova 16-4 in a supplemental game. The Keydets fell to Maine twice 11-10 (10 innings), 6-1 and also dropped two to Wake Forest 10-0, and 6-5 (10 inns.)

The Florida trip revealed two surprising aspects about this year's edition of VMI baseball and if the trends continue, it could be an enjoyable spring on the newly renovated diamond at Patchin Field.

First, VMI showed a considerable amount of power for a team that had lost sluggers Ben Walker (graduation) and John Parrott (injury) this spring. The Keydets wielded some big sticks at the plate including sophomore third baseman Tom Slater, who clouted a pair of homers against Maine, and junior infielder Darren Galleo, who blasted two round trippers in consecutive games. Senior Richard Stone also joined the act with a solo shot in extra innings against Wake Forest.

Secondly, the Keydets received some strong performances from the mound corps particularly from the starting rotation. Todd Tilley, George Armbruster and Mike Doczi all turned in strong stints and sophomore Barry Johnson threw well after spending most of last season rehabilitating an arm injury. The staff departed Florida with two complete games, already half of last season's total.

"I was pleased with our play in some aspects," said first year coach Paul Maini. "We played well for an early season tourney but it's still disappointing not coming away with more wins after being in some close ones."

VMI returns home this week to face James Madison Wednesday afternoon (3 PM) and opens up Southern Conference play this weekend at Patchin Field with a double header against Marshall on Saturday and single game Sunday afternoon. Both games will start at 1 PM.

Darren Galleo led off the Keydet eighth with a single, advanced to second on a sacrifice and scored the tying run on an RBI single by Marshall Simpson. Ren O'Farrell then followed with a double to drive in Simpson with the go ahead run.

Mike Doczi scattered 8 hits and went the distance to pick up his first victory of the season.

Gary Sibayan hit a solo homer for the Keydets in the third.

Ed Camille took the loss for Tars (13-6).

Keydets Sweep Doubleheader from Mountaineers

The VMI baseball team battled adverse weather conditions and a tough Conference foe and managed to overcome both this past weekend.

The Keydets posted two victories and one loss against defending S.C. Northern Division champ Appalachian State. After dropping the opener 7-1 on Saturday in a five inning rain shortened affair at Patchin Field, VMI switched its doubleheader to W&L's Smith Field and swept a pair, 8-4 and 6-4.

The wins boosted VMI's overall mark to 8-10 and tightened the divisional race considerably. Appalachian State fell to 4-3 and is tied with Marshall while VMI stands a half game back at 3-3.

In the series opener, Appalachian State erupted for six runs in the third inning to break open a 1-1 game. Keith Nail broke the tie with a two run single and following a Tommy Green single, Darron Healy hit an opposite field three-run homer to make it 6-1. Garrett Hinshaw followed with a solo home run to close out the scoring.

On Sunday, VMI jumped to a 5-1 start behind home runs by Gary Sibayan, Marshall Simpson and Darren Galleo. Galleo's blast gave the Keydets a 5-4 lead and proved to be the game winner. Keydet starter Todd Tilley scattered 11 hits and managed to avoid serious trouble as the Mountaineers stranded 13 runners.

In the nightcap, VMI third baseman Tom Slater blasted a two run homer to left to break a 4-4 tie in the sixth inning and reliever Mark Craft shut down the Mountaineers in the seventh to pick up his first victory of the season.

The Keydets faced West Chester yesterday afternoon and play Bucknell this afternoon at Patchin Field. VMI opens its Southern Conference road schedule with a three game series this weekend at East Tennessee State.

Keydets Take Two of Three from Marshall; Grab First Place in SC North

The VMI baseball team jumped into first place in the Southern Conference North Division by taking two of three games from Marshall University this weekend in Huntington, WV.

The Keydets (14-14) dropped the opener on Saturday 9-8 in 10 innings, but rebounded on Sunday to sweep a doubleheader 8-4, 9-7. The wins vaulted VMI past Appalachian State into first place with a 7-5 Conference record, 1/2 game ahead of the Mountaineers at 7-6. Marshall is in third place with a 6-7 record, followed by scrappy East Tennessee at 5-7. The top two finishers qualify for the Conference baseball tournament April 29-May 1 in Asheville, NC.

In Saturday's series opener, the Keydets pounded out 14 hits but were outlasted by Marshall's 13 hit barrage, including Todd Hayes' 10th inning single which gave the Herd the victory. VMI rallied from an 8-6 deficit to tie it in the seventh on Tom Slater's two run homer but the Herd generated three consecutive singles for the winner in the 10th off hard luck reliever George Armbruster, who hurled brilliantly in relief with 10 strikeouts in six innings of work. Slater drove in four runs to lead the VMI attack and Criss Finwood went 4 for 5 and knocked in three runs.

The Keydets got revenge on Sunday through the hot bat of Andy Beasley and strong pitching of Todd Tilley and John Glover. Beasley blasted a grand slam off reliever John Chaffin to break open a 4-2 game in the sixth inning while Tilley scattered six hits and struck out nine to win his second consecutive start and raise his record to 3-2.

In the nightcap, the Keydets poured across three runs in the sixth inning to break a 5-5 tie and received an insurance run from Beasley's solo homer in the seventh inning. Relievers John Glover and Barry Johnson perserved the lead despite late inning homers by Russ Nixon and Ty Phillips.

The Keydets faced Ferrum yesterday afternoon and play host to Longwood on Thursday before heading to Boone, NC to take on Appalachian for a three game series between the top two teams in the North Division.

After dropping in-state games to Lynchburg and Richmond, the VMI baseball team buckled down and swept a three game series from East Tennessee State to claim the Southern Conference North Division crown for the first time since 1969.

The Keydets won two over the Bucs Saturday in almost identical fashion by the scores of 7-2 and 7-1. On Sunday, the Keydets pounded ETSU 20-3 behind a 21-hit barrage that produced the highest single game run total of the season. The wins lifted the season mark to 19-18, surpassing the former school season record of 16 wins set in 1965, 1984 and 1987.

In the most productive display of offense this season, the Keydets hit .383 over the ETSU series and blasted 8 homers in the cozy confines of renovated Patchin Field. Leading the way was catcher Andy Beasley, who went 5 for 9 with three homers and 10 RBIs, and outfielder Ren O'Ferrall who hit 5 for 12 with 8 RBIs and stroked three round trippers. Seniors Criss Finwood and Richard Stone, both four year starters, went 4 for 5 in their final home game appearances at Patchin Field.

While the VMI bats were smoking, the Keydet starting rotation effectively shut down the Buccaneer offense. Todd Tilley and Mike Doczi both hurled complete game victories on Saturday, and George Armbruster struck out 10 batters in 6 1/3 innings work on Sunday before giving way to reliever Barry Johnson. With the wins, Tilley raised his record to 4-3 while Doczi pulled even at 5-5 with victories in his last two starts.

The Keydets faced Virginia yesterday in Charlottesville and will depart for Asheville, NC later in the week to meet The Citadel on Friday morning at 11 AM in the first round of the Southern Conference baseball tournament at McMormick Field. It will be the second consecutive trip to the post-season event for VMI and the first baseball encounter with The Citadel since the 1984 SC Tournament.

Keydets Eliminated from Southern Conference Tournament

The VMI baseball team dropped consecutive games in the Southern Conference baseball tournament last weekend and finished the season with a 20-20 record.

The Keydets fell to The Citadel 9-8 on Friday before being eliminated on Saturday by Northern Division rival Appalachian State 11-4. Western Carolina eventually won the tournament on Sunday, pasting The Citadel 22-6 for the Catamount's fourth consecutive SC title.

In VMI's tournament opener, the Keydets fell behind 8-0 in the third inning but put together a substantial rally in the eighth to pull within one run. A four run fifth triggered the comeback and was aided by five Bulldog walks and one costly error.

Ken Vickery's homer in the seventh boosted The Citadel to a 9-5 lead, but it would prove to be the game winner as VMI rallied with four runs over the next three innings. Keydet starter Todd Tilley took the loss to even his record to 4-4.

In Saturday's loser's bracket game, the Mountaineer bats pounded VMI starter Mike Doczi for 11 hits in 3 2/3 innings as ASU jumped to a 5-0 lead. Tommy Green's two run homer in the sixth sparked a three run inning and the Mountaineers pushed across three more runs in the eighth to put the game away. Green proved to be the game's leading hitter with three hits while VMI's Andy Beasley homered to lead the Keydets at the plate.

The 20 wins was the most ever by a baseball squad at VMI, and the 20-20 record was the second consecutive .500 season. Senior Criss Finwood lead the Keydets in hitting with a .399 average and leadoff hitter Gary Sibayan led the squad in home runs with 12. Catcher Andy Beasley knocked in 43 runs for a team high while reliever George Armbruster paced the pitching staff with a 3.60 ERA.
