COACHES - **Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76)**, a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, is in his third season in Lexington. After running the triple option each of his first two years, and leading the Big South in rushing in the process, Woods will institute a new, more balanced attack this year.

Woods, 56, was named the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 118-year history on February 12, 2008. That marked his return to the FCS (I-AA) ranks, where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons, from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 71-65-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Jay Mills (Western Washington '84) is in his eighth season as head coach of the Buccaneers where he has a 45-64 mark. In 2005 he guided CSU to a Big South Conference championship and followed with a school-record nine wins in 2006.

Over the 2005 and 2006 campaigns, he guided the Bucs to 14 straight wins which was the nation's second longest winning streak. Mills was selected Big South Conference Coach of the Year in 2005. Mills previously served as offensive coordinator at Harvard and quarterbacks coach at Boise State. He also was a head coach for three seasons at Minnesota-Morris.

A VMI Win against CSU would -

Give VMI its first win over CSU since 2005 and first win in North Charleston since 2002.

Give VMI its first road win since October 24, 2009 when the Keydets dispatched Presbyterian College, 20-13, in Clinton, S.C.

SATURDAY'S GAME VS. CHARLESTON SOUTHERN-

THE SERIES - VMI and Charleston Southern will be meeting for the 10th time on Saturday and the Bucs hold a 5-4 lead in the series. VMI took the first three meetings between the schools and four of the first five in the series. The Bucs have turned the tables, however, winning the last four match-ups in close fashion as all games have been decided by a 10-point margin or less. VMI has dropped three straight in North Charleston and claimed its only win at CSU Stadium in 2002.

IT HAPPENED ON OCTOBER 23 -

VMI FOOTBALL - VMI blanks Richmond, 14-0 at City Stadium to claim the Tobacco Bowl on October 23, 1982. Kelly Raber completed 14 of 26 passes for 182 yards and Stan Bass (60 yards) and Anthony Agostinelli (50 yards) combined for 110 yards rushing.

WORLD EVENTS - In 1945, Jackie Robinson officially signed his contract with the Montreal Royals, the AAA affiliate of the Brooklyn Dodgers. Robinson would go on to break Major League Baseball's color barrier the following year, and win the National League's Rookie of the Year award for the 1946 season.

VMI TEAM NOTES -

HITTING THE ROAD - The Keydets will play four of the next five games on the road with the lone remaining home game scheduled on November 6 against Coastal Carolina.

KEYDETS TELEVISED A RECORD SEVEN TIMES - VMI's last six games of 2010 are scheduled to appear on either television on ESPN produced broadband, including this Saturday's VMI-Charleston Southern game which will be aired on SportSouth. The Keydets are making a record seven TV appearances in 2010.

LIBERTY GAME REDUX - VMI redshirt freshman Adam Morgan made his first career start at quarterback against Liberty on Saturday afternoon. Morgan completed six of 15 passes for 51 yards and a long of 16 yards. Morgan played the entire first half and part of the third quarter before redshirt junior Cam Jones, who had started VMI's first five games of the season, was inserted in the game. Freshman QB Eric Kordenbrock also saw action in the fourth quarter, marking the fifth time in six games that VMI has employed three quarterbacks in a game.

Freshman quarterback Eric Kordenbrock threw a touchdown pass for the second consecutive game when he connected with Chaz Jones for a 13-yard score in the fourth quarter against Liberty. It was the first career TD reception for Chaz Jones.

Sophomore linebacker Weston Reber missed his second straight game with a groin injury and was replaced in the lineup by redshirt junior Eric Church. Weber is working to get back into his starting role this Saturday when the Keydets face Charleston Southern.

Redshirt junior A.J. Gross posted a career-high in tackles when he had five solos and 11 assists for 16 tackles against Liberty. Gross had earlier logged a season-high 11 tackles against Presbyterian College Oct. 2. Gross continues to top the team defensive charts with 51 tackles.

Through six games, VMI has improved its turnover margin from a year ago at this point. Currently, the Keydets have a -8 turnover ratio and have lost just three fumbles on the year, compared to a -11 turnover margin and 13 fumbles lost through six games in 2009.

Junior wide receiver T.J. Talley caught a season and career-high five passes for a career-high 76 yards against Liberty. Talley moved atop the team charts in receptions 20 catches on the season.

STONY BROOK GAME REDUX - Redshirt senior defensive end Damiso Alexander had a career-high 11 tackles with a sack for one yard against Stony Brook.

Freshman quarterback Eric Kordenbrock connected with senior wideout Mario Scott for an 80-yard touchdown pass against Stony Brook which was VMI's longest play from scrimmage this season and the seventh longest pass play in VMI school history. It was also the first career touchdown pass for Kordenbrock and eighth career TD reception for Scott.

Scott has set career-highs in catches the last two weeks. He had five catches for 59 yards against Presbyterian two weeks ago, and had seven catches for 107 yards against Stony Brook. It

was the first 100-yard receiving game for a VMI player since Tim Maypray had 209 yards against Charleston Southern on November 3, 2007.

Redshirt junior tailback Julian Bowers returned to action against Stony Brook after missing two games with a turf toe injury.

THREE AT QB - As noted above, VMI played three quarterbacks against Liberty, marking the fifth time this season that occurred. The only game that Eric Kordenbrock, Cam Jones and Adam Morgan have not all seen action was Oct. 2's 24-13 win over Presbyterian, when only one of the QB's (Jones) saw action.

PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE GAME REDUX -

Senior wideout Mario Scott snagged a then-career-high five catches for 59 yards and two touchdowns to help VMI to the win over Presbyterian College. Scott opened up the game's scoring with a seven-yard TD reception and hauled in a 12-yard scoring pass that secured the victory on VMI's final possession in the fourth quarter. His longest reception of the day was 18 yards and he was a key in VMI's 10 of 19 third down conversion rate. Scott became the first Keydet wideout to catch two TD passes this season.

Three other VMI players posted career-highs in receptions against PC. Redshirt junior back Chaz Jones had five catches for 43 yards, freshman wideout Trent White had four catches for 45 yards including a clutch 33-yard grab on VMI's final scoring drive, and junior T.J. Talley had four catches for 36 yards.

Keydet quarterback Cameron Jones, who entered the Presbyterian College game with a 45% completion percentage, connected on 21 of 35 passes for 195 yards and tossed two touchdowns against the Blue Hose. He also guided the VMI offense to a 10 of 19 in third down conversions. Jones took all 78 snaps under center against Presbyterian College becoming the first Keydet QB to play the entire game this season.

VMI held a season-high 37:10 to 22:50 time of possession advantage against Presbyterian College.

The Keydets won their first conference opener since 2008 and moved to 2-0 at home since '08.

Redshirt senior linebacker Kris Ware made his first career interception in the first half against Presbyterian and later added a seven-yard sack.

VMI set season-highs in rushing (130 yards), rushing attempts (43), pass completions (21), and first downs (22) against Presbyterian College.

GROSS GARNERS TOP DEFENSIVE HONOR - Redshirt junior linebacker A.J. Gross (Waldorf, Md./Westlake High School) was named Big South Conference Player of the Week, the conference office announced Monday, Oct. 4 in Charlotte.

In VMI's 24-13 win over Presbyterian College Oct. 2 in Lexington, Gross finished with nine tackles (four solo and five assisted), a team season-high three tackles-for-loss (minus-3 yards) and forced a fumble in VMI's victory over Presbyterian College. One of his TFL's forced a

third-and-long, while another stop came on third down and led to a punt. Gross helped the VMI defense limit PC to 205 yards of offense, 10 first downs and just 1-of-12 on third down opportunities.

Gross earned the BSC Defensive player of the Week honor for the second time in his career. In the conference opener of 2008, Gross logged 13 tackles in a 47-20 win over Coastal Carolina in Lexington. Gross, a Biology major, currently ranks second on the team with 25 tackles and ranks second in tackles-for-loss.

VIRGINIA GAME REDUX - Junior free safety Trae Watkins turned in both an interception and a fumble recovery against Virginia on Sept. 25. It was VMI's first interception of the year. Through three games, VMI has not lost a fumble on the season.

The crowd of 43,592 Sept. 25 at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville was the largest gathering VMI football has played in front of since a crowd of 50,400 witnessed the Keydets against North Carolina at Kenan Stadium in 1989.

Redshirt sophomore tight end Robbie White snagged his first career pass reception - one-yarder against Virginia which resulted in a touch-down. On the season, VMI has already thrown four touchdown passes through three games after producing just six all last season.

Senior cornerback Michael Rainey-Wiles had seven solo tackles to lead VMI on the defensive charts against Virginia. On the season, Rainey-Wiles has 17 stops - 16 of the solo variety.

Redshirt senior defensive tackle Ben Brandt had 2.5 tackles for loss against UVA Saturday including 1.5 sacks for -20 yards. He also forced a fumble.

The Keydets saw the return of two veterans to the lineup against Virginia after missing the first two games with injury. Sophomore wide receiver Stefawn Ross made his debut in the first half after missing the first two contests with a turf toe ailment. Redshirt junior running back Chaz Jones played extensively in the backfield after an ankle injury kept him from VMI's first two games.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND - For two games this season, VMI will have a New York state of mind. The Keydets' trip to Long Island to play Stony Brook on Oct. 9 was the first of two games VMI will play in the Empire State this year. VMI travels to West Point, N.Y. on October 30 to face the Army Black Knights.

TWO FBS TEAMS ON KEYDET SLATE - The Virginia game marked the first of two FBS opponents on the 2010 VMI football schedule. The Keydets later travel to West Point, N.Y. on October 30 to play Army for the second consecutive season. It marks the first time in 25 years

that VMI has played two FBS teams in the same season. In 1985, VMI opened at Virginia before taking on North Carolina two weeks later.

ITOKA SETS CAREER-HIGH - Senior running back Gabe Itoka rushed for a career-high 85 yards on 21 carries against William & Mary on September 11, eclipsing his previous high of 64 yards set against Liberty in 2008.

RAINEY-WILES SETS BSC MARK - Senior Michael Rainey-Wiles set a new Big South single game record for punt return yards when he logged 112 yards in the September 4 opener against Lock Haven. Through three games, Rainey-Wiles was leading the Big South in punt returns in a 19.1 yards per return average.

LOCK HAVEN GAME REDUX - The Keydets unveiled their new pro-style offense against Lock Haven, after running the option the past four years. VMI threw for 304 yards, as compared to just 769 yards passing for the entire 2009 season.

The 304 yards through the air was the Keydets' first 300-yard game since Oct. 22, 2005 when VMI passed for 327 yards against Gardner-Webb.

VMI did not commit a turnover in the season-opening victory. It marked the first time that had happened since the no-turnover effort at then-#1 Richmond on Sept. 26 of last season.

Michael Rainey-Wiles' 52-yard punt return for a TD was VMI's first since Tim Maypray's school-record 86-yard runback against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 3, 2009.

The Keydet defense turned in a strong second half, forcing the Bald Eagles into six three-and-out possessions in eight series. In that second half, VMI allowed just five first downs, 17 rushing yards, 52 passing yards and 69 total yards.

Sophomore Jeff Sexton opened the scoring with a career-long 38-yard field goal, but bettered that effort just minutes later when he put through a 44-yard try. He also booted a career-high 12 points against Lock Haven.

Senior wideout Bryan Barnson pulled in a career-high five catches against Lock Haven, surpassing the four he caught against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 3, 2009.

RAINEY-WILES TABBED SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK - Senior return specialist Michael Rainey-Wiles was named Big South Conference Special Teams Player of the Week, for games played between Sept. 2-4.

In VMI's Sept. 4 48-6 win over Lock Haven, Rainey-Wiles returned four punts for 112 yards, including a 52-yarder for a touchdown in the third quarter. It was his first career punt return TD, and VMI first such return for a score since Tim Maypray went 86 yards to the endzone against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 3, 2009. Rainey-Wiles also had punt returns of 29 and 20 yards to give VMI solid field position Saturday, and he returned the opening kickoff 31 yards as well, leading to VMI's first points of the game.

Rainey-Wiles became the first Keydet football player to win a BSC Special Teams honor since Maypray received the citation for the 2009 Gardner-Webb game. He also made his debut on the defensive side of the ball against Lock Haven, as he made his first career start at cornerback after playing three years as an offensive player. He was credited for three solo tackles against the Bald Eagles.

HELMET CHANGES - When the Keydets took the field in the opener against Lock Haven, something happened for the first time since 1988. The VMI "spider", the Institute's long-standing logo that is comprised of interlocking letters, appeared on the Keydet gold headgear in the 2010 season opener. VMI had not displayed the spider on helmets since Nov. 20, 1988 when the Keydets faced Western Carolina. VMI did wear the spi-

der on white helmets for four years (1985-88) under head coach Eddie Williamson.

KEYDETS TOUGH IN OPENERS - VMI opened its 120th season with a 48-6 win over Lock Haven on Sept. 4, and took its sixth straight home opener in the process. That is the second-longest string in the Big South. VMI now holds a 74-44-2 mark since first fielding a team in 1891 and is 8-4 over the past 11 years in openers.

KEYDET SCORING STREAK ENDS - The William & Mary game ended VMI's consecutive game scoring streak which had reached 61 straight games. The streak was the longest such run in the 119-year history of the program, besting a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924 and was the second-longest such streak in the Big South Conference.

VMI ended its five-quarter scoring drought early in the second quarter against Virginia with a Cam Jones-Robbie White one-yard touchdown pass.

Despite the similar numbers, the most recent streak doesn't quite compare to the offensive prowess of the Flying Squadron days.

During the recent 61-game streak, VMI had scored 1,426 points for an average of 22.9 per game. Over the previous 43-game streak, the Keydets scored 1,138 points, averaging 26.5 points per contest.

Included in that run was the 1920 campaign that still stands as the school's only undefeated and untied mark. While going 9-0, VMI defeated Hampden-Sydney 136-0 and Catholic 96-0. That squad still holds the pre-SoCon realignment school record for points in a season, outscoring their opponents 431-20, averaging 47.9 points per game.

ALLEN TOPS CHARTS - Defensive back Byron Allen is VMI's leading returning tackler, and is second on the team this year with 33 stops (17 solo, 16 assists) in 2010, having posted 188 career stops overall, including 93 of the solo variety. Entering the PC game, Allen is 158 tackles out of the #10 spot on the program's career chart.

Last season, he ranked in the country's top-25 in tackles per game for much of the year, fueled by performances like his fifth double-digit tackle game of the season, when he finished with a career-high 17 tackles (eight solo, nine assists) against Liberty. In this season's opener against Lock Haven, Allen led the VMI defensive charts with three solo tackles and six assists.

RUSH DEFENSE MUCH IMPROVED- The 2009 Keydet rush defense, which finished third in the Big South, ranked among one of the best units in Keydet history of late. The team allowed 146.8 ypg on the ground, compared to 2008's 194.1 ypg mark.

VMI's average ranked as the lowest output since the Keydets allowed just 120.9 yards per contest back in 1977. In fact, it hasn't even been close in recent years, as VMI's 1982 rush defense that held opponents to 154.4 ypg was the previous low during the stretch since 1977.

KEYDETS FALL JUST SHORT AT ARMY - VMI narrowly missed a bid to obtain its first win over a FBS program since being reclassified FCS in 1982 when it fell, 22-17 at Army last Nov. 14 at Michie Stadium in West Point, N.Y.

Fullback Howard Abegesah's 44-yard TD run put the Keydets up, 17-16, early in the fourth quarter, but Army's Patrick Mealy countered with a 17-yard run at the 8:17 mark to put the Black Knights up for good. VMI had its last two drives of the game end on downs in Army territory. The two teams will meet again this season, as VMI again goes to West Point, this time on Oct. 30.

MISSING OFFENSE - VMI will be replacing several offensive pieces this season, as the Keydets move to the new pro-style offense. Two of the top scorers in program history, Kyle Hughes and Tim Maypray, have graduated, and the same applies for former running back Howard Abegesah. Hughes is now a volunteer assistant with the Keydets, while Maypray has become a CFL sensation, already posting two kickoff returns of over 100 yards this season.

THREE KEYDETS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE - VMI football's Josh Wine, Emilio Calvin and Marc Ray earned Big South Preseason All-Conference honors, according to information released by the league at its media day in Charlotte, N.C. in mid-July.

Wine, who will anchor the middle of VMI's defensive front in 2010, was an All-Big South Second Team member following last season. He led Big South down linemen in tackles with 63, including a career-high 10 stops versus Charleston Southern. Overall, he helped the Keydets to their best run defense numbers since 1977, as VMI allowed just 146.8 yards per game on the ground.

Calvin, who was tabbed preseason All-Big South at linebacker, ranked third on the 2009 team in tackles with 66. The Second Team All-Big South member also was 13th in the conference in tackles-per-game (6.0), and tied for fifth in tackles-for-loss per game (0.2). His overall total of tackles-for-loss, 9.0, led the Keydets as well.

Finally, punter Ray comes off a year where he was named All-Conference First Team, the only returning Keydet to earn those laurels. He was the first VMI punter to be named First Team All-Conference since 2002, and led the Big South in punting average at 38.9 yards per punt. That total included four punts of over 50 yards.

In the preseason poll, which was also released at the media day proceedings, VMI was voted sixth. The Keydets finished with 31 points, placing ahead of Presbyterian College (18 pts.). Gardner-Webb was fifth (54), with the lowest preseason ranking they have had since the Big South launched football in 2002. The poll's top four were Liberty, who received 13 of the 15 first-place votes and 103 points overall, Stony Brook (81 pts., one first-place vote), Coastal Carolina (68) and Charleston Southern (65 pts., one first-place vote).

NEW STAFF ADDITIONS - As the Keydets enter the third year under Sparky Woods' leadership, their head man has made a handful of changes to the coaching staff. Three additions, in fact, have joined the Keydets for the 2010 season.

Matt Campbell comes to VMI as its new offensive coordinator, and will also work with the linemen in developing the Keydets' new offensive attack. Campbell brings a wealth of experience to the Institute, including eight years as an NFL player and time as a collegiate player under Coach Woods at South Carolina.

After playing tight end for the Gamecocks from 1990-93, Campbell was invited to participate in the Senior Bowl and attended the NFL combine. Campbell then embarked on his NFL career which began with the New Orleans Saints, and then on to the Carolina Panthers, where he stayed through the 2001 campaign.

He then closed out his professional football career with stints with the Washington Redskins and Houston Texans. Campbell recently served as offensive line coach and co-coordinator and

Bluffton High School in Bluffton, South Carolina and coached for three seasons. He also helped start the athletics program at Cross Episcopal School and served as its athletic director from 2005 to 2007.

Mayur Chaudhari begins his first season as a member of the VMI football staff and will assist with the secondary working with the Keydet safeties. He is reunited with VMI defensive coordinator A.J. Christoff after working with him on the football staff at Stanford University.

Chaudhari brings 9 seasons of college football coaching experience and has worked on staffs of all four divisions (FBS, FCS, Division II and Division III) including San Jose State University, UC Davis twice, Menlo College and Stanford University.

Chaudhari recently coached at San Jose State University where he worked as a defensive and assistant special teams coach for two seasons. He worked with the Spartans safeties in 2009 and was assistant linebackers coach in 2008. He began his career in 1998 at UC Davis as an offensive assistant. In three seasons with the Aggies (1998-2001), he worked with the running backs, tight ends, assisted the offensive coordinator with the offensive linemen and was the video coordinator. He returned to UC Davis in 2007 and was the team's linebackers coach.

During the 2005 season, Chaudhari was Menlo College's running backs coach, video coordinator and assisted in recruiting. He spent the 2006 season at Stanford as an assistant to the defensive staff.

George Handler, who recently graduated from VMI and was an all-conference lineman for the Keydets, will coach the Keydet tight ends this fall. Handler was selected first team All-Big South in 2009 after the Keydets led the nation (FCS) in rushing for the second straight year and the Big South for the fourth consecutive year.

In 2008, Handler was second among all down linemen in knockdowns with 49. Handler was a four-year starter who played every position on the offensive line and made 41 consecutive career starts. He was also selected 2008 Second Team All-Big South and 2009 Preseason All-Big South selection at offensive line.

Handler graduated from VMI in December, 2009 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. He was named to the 2008-09 Big South Presidential Honor Roll.

Also, Greg Shockley has been assigned to coach running backs, shifting titles to account for the new style offense.

Game 1- VMI vs. Lock Haven

Keydets Rout Lock Haven in Opener, 48-6

LEXINGTON, Va. - VMI jumped out to a 20-0 lead and never looked back, en route to a 48-6 win over the Lock Haven Bald Eagles in the season opener for both teams, played Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

The Keydets (1-0) won their sixth consecutive season opener behind 304 yards passing between three different quarterbacks. Lock Haven (0-1) was held to 69 yards of total offense in the second half, and gained just five first downs over the last two quarters.

The Keydets got on the board on their opening drive, driving for a 38-yard field goal by Jeff Sexton. The 10-play drive covered just 39 yards, but ate up 4:56 as only one play gained over six yards, that play being a 16-yard third down pass from starting quarterback Cameron Jones to tight end Josh Favaro.

After VMI took the 3-0 lead, Lock Haven was able to gain a first down, but was forced to punt shortly thereafter. The snap went over the punter's head and led to a turnover on downs, giving the Keydets possession at the LHU 30. Four plays later, Sexton booted through his second field goal of the opening quarter, a career-long 44-yard try, putting VMI up 6-0 with 3:29 left in the opening quarter. That remained the score at the conclusion of the period, a quarter marred by some nine penalties between the clubs.

VMI got off to a strong start in the second quarter, as quarterback Jones found Gabe Itoka for a 25-yard completion, giving the Keydets a first down at the visitors' 30. From there, the Keydets would lose six yards and send Sexton out for a 52-yard try which came up short, giving the Bald Eagles solid field position. After picking up a first down on a personal foul, Lock Haven notched a 26-yard scamper down to the Keydet 10. The VMI defense stiffened and forced Lock Haven into a fourth-and-goal from the 27, which went for naught and the score remained 6-0, VMI.

On the resultant drive, the Keydets cashed in for their first touchdown of 2010, a Julian Bowers four-yard run. After Sexton tacked on the extra point, VMI had a 13-0 cushion.

After a three-and-out, VMI would add to its lead once again. With freshman Adam Morgan at quarterback, VMI went 51 yards in nine plays over just 1:53 on the game clock, and Morgan ended the drive with a fade pass to T.J. Talley in the back of the endzone. Talley went over the Bald Eagle defender and snared the pass, and the Keydets took a 20-0 lead. Lock Haven would respond in the final 1:33, going 61 yards in just 1:17 and getting on the board with a 20-yard touchdown pass. The extra point was blocked, but Lock Haven had cut the half-time deficit to 20-6 despite nine penalties.

A three-and-out on LHU's opening drive of the second half gave VMI quality field position, and the Keydets cashed in with a quick five-play drive. Bowers capped the brief effort with his second touchdown of the game, a one-yard run up the middle, pushing VMI to a 27-6 advantage. Moments later, Michael Rainey-Wiles took a Lock Haven punt 52 yards down the near sideline for a touchdown, giving the Keydets a 34-6 edge with 9:44 left in the third quarter. The special teams touchdown was VMI's first since last season's Gardner-Webb game, when Tim Maypray returned a punt a VMI-record 86 yards.

Once again, the VMI defense forced another three-and-out series, giving their team the ball at their own 49. On third down, Jones found Gabe Itoka to the quarterback's right and hit him with a 19-yard pass. A 15-yard face mask penalty was tacked on at the end of the play, moving VMI to the Lock Haven 17. Two plays later, Jones found Trent White on a crossing pattern in the left corner of the end zone, and Sexton's point after made it 41-6, VMI, just halfway through the third quarter. After an exchange of punts, Morgan led the Keydets on a six-play, 62-yard drive that ended with a 46-yard touchdown pass to Itoka, capping the scoring with 8:49 to play in the contest. Freshman Eric Kordenbrock saw at quarterback for VMI late in the game, but neither squad could score the rest of the way.

VMI was led by several players on the day, as Jones threw for a career-high 156 yards while Morgan added 120. Nine different Keydets had receptions, and on the ground, Bowers had two touchdown runs. Defensively, Byron Allen had nine tackles to pace VMI, while Damiso Alexander had 2.5 tackles-for-loss, just missing his career high (3.0). Alexander's 2.5 stops behind the line were part of a strong Keydet defensive effort, as VMI had 9.0 tackles-for-loss on the day, accounting for a loss of 60 yards for Lock Haven.

VMI football will return to action Saturday, Sept. 11, as the Keydets travel to Williamsburg, Va. to take on #4 William & Mary. Game time is set for 7 p.m.

Quotes - VMI Head Coach Sparky Woods

"It's a great win. I want to commend Lock Haven. They came in and played hard and played real well on the line of scrimmage in the first half. I was proud of our team of staying the course and continuing to execute."

"Defensively, we played well early and then we gave up that touchdown right before the half. The character we showed by coming out the second half was great and then the game went the way we hoped it would and we won the game handedly. We protected the ball and a lot of people played and we didn't turn the ball over. Also, we didn't have center-quarterback errors, any delay of game problems, and we stayed on the ball on defense even though we didn't tackle well early."

"Jeff Sexton showed what his second year has done for him, and he kept us in the game early with some long kicks on those first few drives. I couldn't have asked for the game to go much better. I am proud of this team. I know they want to play well and they want to win, and they've done everything we have asked them to do in the win today. It was a great day for VMI and I am happy for everybody."

Game 2- VMI vs. #11 William & Mary

Tribe Blanks Keydets in Williamsburg

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. - The William & Mary Tribe intercepted five passes and handed VMI a 45-0 setback Saturday night, Sept. 11, at Zable Stadium in Williamsburg.

VMI suffered its first loss of the season and fell to 1-1. The Tribe victory in its home opener evened the host's season mark to 1-1.

William & Mary quarterback Mike Callahan keyed the Tribe attack by completing 12 of 17 passes for 234 yards and two touchdowns. His favorite target was Ryan Moody, who hauled in four passes for 110 yards.



Gabe Itoka ran for 85 yards against William & Mary.

VMI senior half back Gabe Itoka led all ground gainers with 85 yards on 21 carries. William & Mary tailback Jonathan Grimes rushed for 71 yards and three touchdowns. The Keydets were shutout for the first time in 61 games - a scoring streak that dated back to the 2004 season.

VMI took the opening drive and moved into William & Mary territory at the 43, but on a third-and-10 situation, starting quarterback Cam Jones had his pass picked off over the middle by Tribe strong safety Brian Thompson who raced 22 yards up the right sideline to the VMI 43. The Keydet defense forced the Tribe to punt on a three-and-out and the Keydets were able to escape further damage.

VMI was forced to punt on its ensuing drive and the Tribe special teams produced the game's first points. Return man B.W. Webb took a Marc Ray punt back 64 yards down the right boundary for a touchdown. David Miller's extra point was good and William & Mary took a 7-0 lead with 9:55 remaining in the first quarter.

The Keydets bounced back with a 13-yard run by Itoka to the William & Mary 50, followed by a Jones 12-yard pass to wideout T.J. Talley to the Tribe 38. After a four-yard rush by Itoka, the drive stalled with a false start penalty and a two-yard rushing loss. The Keydets saw their best first half penetration into Tribe territory end when a fourth-and-two rush was thwarted at the 30.

William & Mary then moved 58 yards on nine plays but had to settle for a 30-yard field goal by Miller to put the home team up, 10-0. A 33-yard pass from Callahan to Cameron Doshe was the big play of the possession which gave the Tribe a 10-0 lead with 2:56 left in the quarter. The Tribe tallied its first offensive touchdown of the night in the opening seconds of the second quarter when it moved 66 yards in six plays on a drive capped by tailback Jonathan Grimes one-yard TD run. Another Callahan long pass play - this one to Moody covering 47 yards - keyed the drive. William & Mary led, 17-0, with 14:24 left in the second quarter.

Callahan teamed with Moody again for a 29-yard pass to spark William & Mary's next scoring drive that covered eight plays and 70 yards. Callahan tossed his lone touchdown of the evening to senior wide receiver Chase Hill on a 23-yard strike and following the extra point, William & Mary led 24-0 with 5:18 left in the half.

An interception by William & Mary free safety Terrell Wells set up the Tribe's last score of the half as it moved 52 yards in six plays to set-up a four yard TD run by Grimes with 1:30 left in the second quarter. A Callahan to Moody pass again led the way, this one covering 24 yards to the VMI 4. The Tribe took a 31-0 lead into the locker room.

Grimes' third touchdown of the evening, a one-yard dive at the 3:54 mark of the third quarter, capped a four-play, 48-yard drive that was set up by an interception. William & Mary completed its scoring when redshirt freshman Jerome Couplin snatched a deflected pass from quarterback Eric Kordenbrock intended to tight end Josh Favaro and raced 22 yards for a touchdown with 6:50 left in the game.

VMI's bid to avoid a shutout fell short when Jeff Sexton's 47-yard field goal missed with 13:31 left in the game. The Keydets had moved to the William & Mary 17 during the drive.

The Tribe outgained VMI, 391-239, but limited the Keydet ground game to just 18 yards in the second half. William & Mary converted four-of-five scoring chances in the red zone.

VMI has an open date before facing Virginia on Saturday, September 25 in Charlottesville.

CHARLOTTEVILLE, Va. - A 17-point outburst in the second quarter helped lift Virginia to a 48-7 win over VMI Saturday afternoon before a crowd of 43,592 at Scott Stadium.

Virginia quarterback Marc Verica completed 16-of-23 passes for 224 yards and tossed three touchdown passes to spark the Cavaliers to the win in the first meeting between state rivals in 19 years.

VMI fell to 1-2 on the season while UVA improved to 2-1 with both teams opening respective conference schedules next week.

The Keydets were led by redshirt junior quarterback Cam Jones who completed 10-of-15 passes for 130 yards and one touchdown.

After holding VMI to a three-and-out on its opening drive of the game, The Cavs took over at the VMI 42 and produced the game's first points five plays later when Verica teamed with Dontrelle Inman for a 25-yard touchdown pass to put UVA up, 7-0 at the 11:02 mark of the first quarter. Inman hauled in two receptions for 39 yards on the drive that was aided by a Chase Minnefield 20-yard punt return to the Keydet 42-yard line.

The Keydets missed a scoring opportunity later in the quarter with a missed 30-yard field goal try, but battled back to tie the game late in the first quarter when a scrambling Cam Jones dumped a one-yard TD pass to red-shirt sophomore Robbie White, who snagged his first career touchdown reception. The Jeff Sexton extra point tied the game at 7-7 with 2:35 remaining in the first quarter. The scoring drive was set-up by career-long receptions by junior T.J. Talley (36 yards to the UVA 27) and Chaz Jones (25 yards to the UVA 2) and covered 63 yards in seven plays.

All momentum VMI had captured quickly vanished on the ensuing kick return when Raynard Horne raced 87 yards for a touchdown to put Virginia back on top for the rest of the afternoon.

Leading 14-7 entering the second quarter, The Cavaliers broke the game open with scoring drives over the next two possessions. Verica completed three of four passes for 54 yards including a 27-yard score to wideout Kris Burd to make it 21-7 at the 12:52 mark of the second quarter. The drive was aided by a face mask penalty that moved the ball into VMI territory.

The Cavaliers extended the lead to 28-7 at the 9:07 mark when Minnefield's second interception of the half set up Verica's eight-yard touchdown slant pass to Inman.

Virginia added a 33-yard Robert Randolph field goal with 52.7 remaining and took a 31-7 lead at the break. Randolph later tacked on a 44-yarder on UVA's first possession of the second half.

The Cavaliers added touchdowns later in the half on Robert Matheny to Jared Green 15 yard scoring strike and a 17-yard touchdown reception by Colter Phillips.

Burd led all receivers with eight catches for 119 yards while Inman caught five aeriels for 72 yards and two touchdowns.

Virginia outgained VMI, 466-179 on the afternoon including 341 yards passing and held a 25-8 advantage in first downs.

The Keydet forced three takeaways with fumble recoveries by redshirt junior Kris Ware and a fumble recovery and interception by junior safety Trae Watkins.

Keydet senior cornerback Michael Rainey-Wiles led the VMI defensive charts with seven solo tackles.

VMI opens Big South Conference next Saturday when it faces Presbyterian College in Lexington. Kickoff at Foster Stadium will be 1:30 p.m.

Game 4- Presbyterian College vs. VMI

VMI Wins Big South Opener, 24-13

LEXINGTON, Va. - A 12-yard Cameron Jones touch-down pass to Mario Scott with 1:20 remaining sealed a VMI win over Presbyterian College, 24-13, in the Big South football opener for both schools, played Saturday at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

With the Keydets clinging to a 17-13 lead, VMI got the ball back with 6:09 to play. The Keydets picked up two first downs, but were whistled for a delay of game penalty on third and two, leaving them with a third and seven from just inside PC territory. Cameron Jones then found Trent White for a 33-yard pass completion, moving the Keydets to the 16 and setting up the clinching touchdown.

With the win, VMI equals its record at 2-2 and goes to 1-0 in the Big South, winning its conference opener for the first time since 2008. It is also the first 2-0 home start for VMI since the 2008 campaign, while Presbyterian College drops to 0-5 and 0-1 in conference action.

The Keydets marched down the field on the opening drive, as Chaz Jones ran for half of the drive's 60 yards and a 15-yard pass interference penalty put VMI in scoring range. On the second play after the infraction, Cameron Jones found Mario Scott open in the left corner of the end zone for a seven-yard touchdown. Jeff Sexton converted the extra point, capping the 5:24 drive that put VMI up 7-0.

After a Kris Ware interception on the ensuing drive, VMI came right back down the field. The PC defense stiffened, however, and Sexton came on for a 38-yard field goal try. The kick was good, and with 6:22 left in the opening quarter, VMI had a 10-0 lead.

After a Blue Hose punt, the Keydets had the ball at their own 20. A sack set them back to the 17, and on the ensuing play, Jones was intercepted by PC's Antarius Terrell, who ran the pick into the endzone for a score. The extra point cut the VMI lead to 10-7, which was the score after the first quarter of play.

From there, the teams began to exchange punts. Neither squad could score for a time, but Patrick Morgano of PC was able to uncork a 64-yard punt just minutes into the second quarter. The boot was tied for the fifth-longest in Big South history, and was the longest in the conference this season.

The next key play came with 6:14 left in the half, as PC lined up for a 37-yard field goal. As kicker Cam Miller kicked through the ball, the officials blew their whistles and flagged the Blue Hose for a false start. The ball was pushed back five yards, but Miller converted the ensuing 42-yarder, tying the game at 10.

VMI fired right back on its next drive, putting together a seven-play, 59-yard spurt to retake the lead. Chaz Jones had a 22-yard run and an 18-yard reception on the drive, and he then capped the push with a one-yard touchdown run behind the left guard. Sexton's extra point gave the Keydets a 17-10 lead with 2:47 left in the opening half. Trae Watkins picked off PC quarterback Brandon Miley on the next Blue Hose drive, but the Keydets were forced to punt and the score remained 17-10 at the intermission.

Cameron Jones led VMI in the first half, going 12 of 16 with one touchdown and one interception, while Lance Byrd was PC's offensive leader with 29 yards on the ground.

The Blue Hose went to backup quarterback Myron Gary to open the second half, but neither they nor VMI could dent the scoreboard in the third quarter. The Keydets had one lengthy drive, starting with 8:15 left in the quarter, but it ended when Cameron Jones was sacked on third-and-one from the PC 10. He fumbled the football, and the visitors' Brian Leonardi fell on it for the turnover. PC could not take advantage, and an exchange of punts wrapped up the third quarter with the score still VMI 17, Presbyterian College 10.

The visitors struck again with 12:12 to play, as PC executed a flawless trick play to get into the red zone. Quarterback Gary handed the ball off to Michael Ruff, who ran towards the near sideline. Ruff then paused about seven yards behind the line of scrimmage and threw the ball back across the field, finding a wide-open Gary for a 44-yard gain. With a penalty tacked on, PC had the ball at the Keydet 3, but could not find the end-zone, thanks to two negative rushes and a Greg Walker pass breakup. Miller came on for the 23-yard field goal and drilled it, cutting the VMI lead to 17-13 with 10:29 to play. After an exchange of punts, the stage was set for the drive to seal the win.

Quarterback Cameron Jones had one of the best games of his career, as he set career highs in passing yards (195), attempts (35) and completions (21), while receiver Scott had his first career two-touchdown catch game. Chaz Jones ran for 88 yards and a touchdown, while A.J. Gross had nine tackles on defense. For the Blue Hose, Derek Brown and LJ Perry each recorded double-digit tackles, with 13 and 10 respectively.

The Keydets outgained the Blue Hose, 325-205, and held a 37:10 to 22:50 advantage in time of possession for the contest. VMI converted 10 of 19 in third down situations and held PC to 1 of 12 in third down tries and limited the Blue Hose to 10 first downs.

VMI football will return to action Saturday, Oct. 9, as the Keydets travel to Stony Brook, N.Y. to battle the Stony Brook Seawolves. Game time is set for 3:30 p.m.

Game 5- VMI vs. Stony Brook

Football Falls to Stony Brook, 27-9

STONY BROOK, N.Y. - The Stony Brook Seawolves scored 20 unanswered points in the middle portions of the game and went on to defeat the VMI Keydets, 27-9, in Big South football action contested Saturday afternoon, Oct. 9, at LaValle Stadium in Stony Brook, N.Y.

The 20-point outburst proved to be the difference for Stony Brook, which won its Big South Conference opener. The Seawolves and improved to 2-3 overall. The Keydets fell to 2-3 and 1-1 in the conference.

Stony Brook quarterback Michael Coulter completed 14 of 19 passes for 194 yards and a touchdown and utilized just two receivers on the afternoon. Sophomore wide receiver Jordan Gush caught a game-high nine passes for 115 yards and a touchdown while junior Matt Brevi had five catches for 79 yards.

The Keydets produced the seventh-longest pass play in school history when freshman quarterback Eric Kordenbrock three an 87-yard scoring strike to senior wide receiver Mario Scott in the third quarter.

Stony Brook outgained the Keydets, 379-192, including a 185-8 advantage in rushing. The Seawolves also held a 36:23 to 23:37 edge in possession time for the game.

The first quarter featured just one possession by each team with the Keydets taking a 3-0 lead after one period. VMI took the opening drive and moved 53 yards in 14 plays and settled for a Jeff Sexton 28-yard field goal at the 8:39 mark. The drive consumed 6:21 on the first quarter clock.

Stony Brook countered with a 15-play, 64 drive that piled up 8:42 of possession time that featured a mix of short runs and passes. Sophomore kicker Wes Skiffington tied the game with a 24-yard field goal from the left hash on the first play of the second quarter.

The Seawolves resumed their scoring string later in the first half to break the game open. Taking the ball at its own 46, Coulter fired a 48-yard pass to Brevi to the VMI 5 on the opening play of the drive. Two snaps later, Coulter on a rollout connected with Gush for a five yard touchdown to put SBU up for good in the contest. Skiffington's extra point made it 10-3 which closed out the scoring in the first half.

Stony Brook extended the margin to 13-3 with 9:44 left in the third quarter when Skiffington tacked on a 44-yard field goal to top off a 10-play, 45-yard drive on the Seawolves' opening possession of the second half. SBU had moved to the VMI 23, but a holding penalty and five-yard sack of Colter by VMI defensive end Chris Harper derailed the drive and SBU had to settle for the field goal.

A key turning point of the game took place on VMI's ensuing drive which started at the VMI 9. A dropped pass at midfield on second down would have handed the Keydet offense some breathing room, but VMI was eventually forced to punt instead from its own endzone. Senior punter Mark Ray bobbled the punt formation long snap and the ball was pounced on by SBU's Rich Vitale for a touchdown. Skiffington's extra point pushed the Seawolves to a 20-3 lead with 8:17 remaining in the third quarter.

After an exchange of punts, the Keydets moved the ball to the SBU21 yard line. But the drive evaporated when Cameron Jones' arching pass to Tracy Hairston was picked off by freshman quarterback Devante Wheeler at the two-yard line and returned nine yards, thwarting another scoring opportunity.

VMI's defense held on downs at the Keydet 29 on the Seawolves next possession and Jones was lifted for Kordenbrock when the Keydets took possession. The freshman tossed an incompletion on his first pass attempt, but followed two plays later with a third and 19 strike to Scott down the left sideline to produce what would be VMI's lone touchdown of the game at the 11:22 mark. The extra point try was muffed with a bad snap and VMI trailed, 20-9.

Kordenbrock left the game after getting knocked down on the touchdown pass play and redshirt freshman quarterback Adam Morgan finished up duties at signal caller.

The Seawolves closed out the scoring with a seven-play, 69-yard drive capped by Brock Jackloski's 25-yard end run for a touchdown with 7:09 remaining.

Stony Brook senior defensive end Jonas Roussaau was credited for 3.5 tackles for loss and produced two sacks for 14 yards.

VMI returns home next Saturday to host defending BSC co-champion Liberty at Foster Stadium on Parent's Weekend. Kickoff will be at 1:30 and the game will be televised on the Flames Sports Network and picked up on various cables systems throughout the country.

Game 6- Liberty at VMI

Liberty Downs VMI, 41-7

LEXINGTON, Va. - A big first half sparked the visiting Liberty Flames to a 41-7 win over the VMI Keydets Saturday afternoon in Big South Conference football action in Lexington, Va.

The Flames (5-2, 2-0 Big South) were sparked by Mike Brown's 283 yards of total offense, including 231 yards and three touchdowns through the air. 120 of those passing yards went to Chris Summers, who also had three touchdown catches in the Liberty win. VMI (2-4, 1-2 Big South) was thwarted in its effort to move to 3-0 at home for the first time since 1990, despite A.J. Gross' career-high tying 16 tackles.

After an exchange of punts opened the contest, Liberty embarked on a seven-play, 84-yard drive for the game's first touchdown. No play in the drive went longer than seven yards until the scoring strike, a 54-yard Brown to Summers pass. The Flames tacked on the extra point and were ahead, 7-0.

Another VMI three-and-out gave the visitors the ball on their own 48, and they took advantage of the short field. Brown was 3 for 3 on the drive and also ran for seven yards, but SirChauncey Holloway capped the spurt with a three-yard touchdown run. The point after made it 14-0 Liberty, with 3:30 remaining in the opening quarter.

The score stayed 14-0 after one period, and the second half opened with a 63-yard punt by Liberty's Mike Larsson. Despite being one of the 10 longest kicks in Big South history, it was only the second-best kick in Foster Stadium this year, trailing Patrick Morgano of Presbyterian College's 64-yard try.

Liberty got the ball back at the 12:02 mark and struck again. After two eight-yard plays, Brown found Summers in the right corner of the end zone for a touchdown. Summers' second touchdown catch of the game and the extra point made it 21-0, Liberty.

The ensuing drive saw the Keydets pick up their initial first down of the game, as Adam Morgan found T.J. Talley for a 16-yard completion. Gabe Itoka then had a pair of runs, putting the Keydets in a third-and-short, but a pass went incomplete and forced another VMI punt. The Keydet defense forced a punt as well, but as VMI's punt returner fielded the ball, he fumbled it at the eight-yard line. Liberty recovered and would convert a 25-yard field goal, giving the Flames a 24-0 lead with four minutes left in the half.

The visitors then wrapped up the second quarter with an eight-play, 56-yard drive that ended with Summers' third touchdown catch of the game. The 17-yard strike pushed the Liberty lead to 31-0, which would be the score at halftime. The TD reception made Summers the first VMI opponent to have three touchdown catches in one game since 2005, and the 31 points were the most that VMI had surrendered in Foster Stadium since 2007's season finale against The Citadel.

The Keydets opened the second half with one of their more sustained drives of the day, an eight-play effort. Unfortunately for the home team, it went only for 27 yards and another punt was forced. The teams volleyed punts for several minutes before VMI made a quarterback change, going to Cameron Jones for the first time in the afternoon.

On just his second play, Jones was intercepted by Liberty's Danny Broggin, setting up a seven-play, 36-yard drive that ended in a six-yard touchdown run. Korrey Davis' six-yard touchdown run and the point after pushed the Liberty margin to 38-0 with 4:45 left in the third quarter. In fact, that would remain the score at the end of three periods.

Liberty kicker Matt Bevins hit his second field goal of the day, a 42-yarder with 12:30 left, to cap the Liberty scoring and make the score Flames 41, Keydets 0, but VMI countered on its next drive. Freshman Eric Kordenbrock entered the game at quarterback and led his team on a 69-yard drive that took just four plays, on which he went 4 for 4 through the air. A 15-yard pass interference penalty aided the Keydets, and Kordenbrock capped the drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Chaz Jones. Jones avoided three tackles and made a spinning move into the endzone to break the plane, putting the Keydets on the board and ending the game's scoring, 41-7.

VMI saw Marc Ray set a new career-high in punts with nine, while the Keydets also set a season-high in sacks with five. Liberty's defense was paced by Danny Broggin, who had three tackles including two stops-for-loss, along with an interception and two sacks.

VMI football will return to action Saturday, Oct. 23, as the Keydets travel to Charleston, S.C. to battle the Charleston Southern Buccaneers. Game time is set for 11:30 a.m.
